The Christmas Lights on December 7th was a great success with so many people enjoying the festivities – I'm sure that you enjoyed the procession, the light switch on, the snow and the fireworks. I would like to thank the Organisers and volunteers, the children with their wonderful illuminated umbrellas, the Carol Singers, the fabulous Polar Bear, the Town Cryer and his Escort, the

Firemen, and of course Father Christmas for making the event a 'Night to Remember'! Thanks also to The Castle Hotel and staff; all the stall holders; the entertainment on the Square and Stuart Evans and his helpers for the amazing Grotto!

There were so many events happening over the Christmas period it was hard to keep up! -the enthusiasm of the organisers was very impressive.

It was very sad to see the end of an era for two of the town's best loved shops. 'Gwythers' and 'Burds' decided to close at Christmas after decades of serving Bishop's Castle; their dedication and loyalty has been tremendous. I am sure all of the community joins me in thanking them most sincerely for all their hard work over the decades.

Crime Prevention - Sqt Aston spoke to the Town Council at the December meeting about the Towns and Villages Initiative. This is a comprehensive approach to preventing crime: working with communities, petrol stations, charity shops. Parish Councils and individual members of the public. In particular, Sqt Aston explained the benefit of issuing 'SmartWater Packs' to households as deterrence for crime. With grant aid, the Town Council may be able to purchase these packs for the community. This also links in with the 'The County Lines' task force. Further information on this will be included in future newsletters. Committees who organise the Michaelmas Fair. Party in the Park and other town events are intending on stepping down after 2020, (you may have seen this in the local press). The work load is tremendous, and understandably as the events have evolved, the time and effort is too much for a few members. The Town Council is therefore asking the locals to 'Step In' if you want the town to stay vibrant throughout the year. These events rely on hundreds of volunteers who make them all happen. The Town Council will be holding a public meeting in the coming months to try and come up with an inclusive plan for all.

Bishop's Castle Festivals Coordinator

Background

Bishop's Castle's festivals, such as Michaelmas, bring in significant revenue for the economy of the Town throughout the year, as well as being an important cultural focus for the community. We know that many event visitors later return to spend longer in the Town.

However, these events take an incredible amount of time and effort to run and the cost and bureaucracy involved is growing year on year. The current Michaelmas committee have run highly successful Fairs for the last 5 years and after next year (which is the 25th anniversary), we feel the need to stand down, partly because it is becoming increasingly difficult to sustain our current level of involvement and also because we feel we need to make way for new ideas to help keep the Fair fresh going forward.

At present there aren't obvious people willing to take over from us and AMP (Party in the Park), Christmas Grotto committee and the Carnival committee are in a similar position too.

We therefore are seeking to work with the Town Council to collectively start thinking of strategies by which we might save and maintain these valuable events before it is too late.

Coordinating Bishop's Castle Festivals

We believe that there is an opportunity to market Bishop's Castle Festivals as one co-ordinated package. The festivals working in partnership with the Town Council, Shropshire Tourism, Shropshire Council and local businesses to promote and market Bishop's Castle as a vibrant tourist destination throughout the year.

By working together it may be possible to develop a Town-wide sponsorship scheme with local businesses so that they pay in just once per year into a central pot rather than continually being asked for support by individual festivals throughout the year.

□ It may be possible to work with local hotels, B&Bs and holiday lets
to develop a festivals information package to help them attract cli-
ents. Perhaps we might levy a fee from them which they in turn pass
onto clients by charging extra to stay during festivals periods?

Festivals Coordinator

While it is vital to preserve the unique character of each individual festival, there are many event organising tasks that could be done more efficiently across all festivals.

It is proposed to employ a suitable Festival Coordinator, initially for Michaelmas, with BC Carnival and Xmas Lights/Grotto, to outsource many of the most time consuming tasks.

Possibly this could extend to Clun Green Man and other local festival in future years.

Key tasks

Accounts

Insurance

Admin (eg. risks assessments, performer and caterer contracts, road closures, venue bookings, managing stall bookings, managing vintage vehicle bookings, etc)

Sponsorship / bidding for grants

Publicity - maintaining Facebook, website, flyers, posters, etc

Funding

Suggested salary @ £15 per hour

2 * 8 hour days pro rata for 6 months

Total cost per annum £6,240

To be funded pro rata by those events using the Co-ordinator. Additional funding to come from grants, donations, sponsorship and income from events.

We hope that the Town Council would support this initiative with a grant in at least year 1.

Bishops Castle SNT Team Priorities

The SNT priorities are based on where the most threat, harm and risk lies within the community.

The priorities for 2019 are:

County lines class A drug supply: The network supply of drugs from Urban areas (cities outside West Mercia) into market towns using 'dedicated' mobile telephone lines or 'deal lines' utilising the exploitation of vulnerable adults and children to traffick drugs and money.

SNT serve an important purpose as we can work with residents to identify vulnerable locations where drug dealers may try to set up a criminal enterprise and when identified we will work towards removing them. Our PCSOs are instrumental in the intelligence gathering process.

Child sexual exploitation: Child sexual exploitation (CSE) is a type of child abuse. It happens when a young person is encouraged, or forced, to take part in sexual activity in exchange for something. The reward might be presents, money, alcohol, or simply just the promise of love and affection.

The SNT will work with other agencies and departments within the Police that deal with child safeguarding. Our role ranges from educating school children around this area and also engaging with children at risk. This also serves a wider purpose around youth ASB as often children at risk of CSE are involved in youth ASB.

Domestic abuse: Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, operaive, threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are, or have been, intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality.

The SNT serve an important purpose in giving victims of domestic abuse additional support. It may include regular visits and offer advice around safety and getting them in contact with other agencies that can help victim's breakaway from the cycle of abuse.

Acquisitive crime: Acquisitive crime can vary from a low level theft shoplifting to a residential burglary. This is an area that traditionally is more noticeable to the community at large. The purpose of this being a priority is to address any chronic issues. The purpose of the SNT is not to investigate individual cases of acquisitive crime but rather address the wider issue. For example, if we have a prolific shoplifter the SNT may look to deal with them via a criminal behaviour order. Where there is a residential burglary of vehicle crime a PCSO may attend to give additional reassurance to victims.

All of these areas require partnership working as the Police cannot resolve these problems in isolation. Our partners will be from outside agencies (Social Services, Shropshire Council, Housing associations, and retail community) and within the Police (Integrated offender management team, CSE teams, domestic abuse teams). Where we identify a chronic issue we will consider whether a risk management plan or problem solving plan will need to be implemented. This will allow us to have a clear strategy in place to deal with any chronic issues that impact the local community.
