Hello from your Mayor

The spread of the new Coronavirus could soon become unstoppable; please follow the Chief Medical Officer's advice: there are more details inside. This issue may be the last one for some time so please look on our Web Page, Facebook and notice boards. You can contact the town hall on 630023 for updates or the town clerk on 638141 for council matters: the clerk's office will be closed until further notice and there will be no council meetings for at least two months. We hope and pray for our town and community in these uncertain times.

This will be my last message to you as your Mayor; my Term of Office will end in May. I have enjoyed the last year immensely, it is a very special role to have had and I thank everyone for their support. I have been honoured to receive an invitation by the Lord-Lieutenant of Shropshire to attend the Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace on May 12th and will be very proud to represent Bishop's Castle.

The town Council recently purchased 2 'Parking Buddies', these stand-alone 'SLOW' signs and are put around the town highlighting where there is a speeding problem. I hope that you have all seen them. Cllr Dickin has kindly offered to place them strategically on the pavements where needed.

The new houses at Ox Meadow are nearing completion and I hope that locals have registered their interest to rent or part buy. The Town Council are pleased with the design and look of the development.

We are constantly in talks with Shropshire Council and the Highways regarding the disgraceful state of our roads; County Cllr Ruth Houghton along with Cllr Nigel Hartin and Cllr Heather Kidd has been working hard to get potholes and line markings resolved. It is so frustrating when important matters move so slowly. Please keep reporting potholes and any damage from potholes through 'MyShropshire' – Shropshire Council's website.

The public meeting at the Town Hall on Tuesday 17th March for the 'Neighbourhood Watch Scheme' and the 'SmartWater kits' was postponed. A new date will be set later in the year.

It was sad that two Councillors resigned in March. Cllr Nigel Morris and Cllr Keith Bance will be greatly missed at the meetings; I would like to thank them for all their support.

Mayor's Sunday will be on Sunday 24th May although this may well be postponed; the parade will start at the Town Hall at 10:40am, everyone is welcome to come and support your new Mayor.

Clun Community Larder/Food Bank

The Clun Community Larder/Food Bank has been going for 7 years, and covers the Clun Valley, Bishop's Castle and a large rural area to the north as far as Lydbury North and Chirbury. It is open for 1 and a half hours on a Thursday from 12.30-2pm. in the vestry of St George's Church in Clun.

Weekly uptake of our service is small, but each year we are able to help a number of families who find themselves in financial difficulty. We may only see them once or twice but we know that the help they receive from us, when they are at their lowest ebb, is important. We would like to help more people who may not know they can ask for help.

People are usually referred to us by a support worker, someone in their community or a concerned friend. Please contact us if you, or someone you know would benefit from short term help from us. Or you can refer yourself for help. If you struggle on benefits during school holidays for example and your teenagers, who would normally have a good meal at school, are eating you out of house and home, get in touch. We may be able to help you.

Christmas time is a particularly busy time for the larder as we prepare large Christmas parcels to help out struggling families and provide treats for their children. This past Christmas we prepared 37 substantial parcels for families which included a total of 60 children. Many thanks to everyone who donated to ensure that none of these children went without.

The public are very generous in their donations, and from time to time when we have had surplus food we have been able to help out larger food banks in Bridgnorth and Ludlow. If you are planning to donate food to the larder, tinned and packet foods with a long shelf life are welcome. We regret we cannot accept home-made food or fresh produce. Donations can be left at the back of St George's Church, but to avoid us having too much of a particular product, do please get in touch first so we can tell you what our current situation is and what we are short of

We have recently had discussions with a resident of Bishop's Castle who suggested that there may be a wish for an annexe of the food bank in Bishop's Castle itself. That would avoid the need to travel, in light of the current restrictions and contributing to reducing carbon emissions. Church Stretton and SpArC Leisure Centre Update- week commencing 17th February 2020

What are Shropshire Council doing;

The Council's aims, county-wide, are to:

- Embed leisure centres into local communities
- Engage with local communities to deliver a service that meets the needs of residents
- Rebrand Leisure Services to include a new logo and website
- Reduce its carbon footprint.

We have appointed a Leisure Facilities Team Leader to support the running of Shropshire Council's five Joint Use Centres

Bishop's Castle Festivals Coordinator

Background

Bishop's Castle's festivals, such as Michaelmas, bring in significant revenue for the economy of the Town throughout the year, as well as being an important cultural focus for the community. We know that many event visitors later return to spend longer in the Town.

However, these events take an incredible amount of time and effort to run and the cost and bureaucracy involved is growing year on year. The current Michaelmas committee have run highly successful Fairs for the last 5 years and after next year (which is the 25th anniversary), we feel the need to stand down, partly because it is becoming increasingly difficult to sustain our current level of involvement and also because we feel we need to make way for new ideas to help keep the Fair fresh going forward.

At present there aren't obvious people willing to take over from us and AMP (Party in the Park), Christmas Grotto committee and the Carnival committee are in a similar position too.

We therefore are seeking to work with the Town Council to collectively start thinking of strategies by which we might save and maintain these valuable events before it is too late.

Coordinating Bishop's Castle Festivals

We believe that there is an opportunity to market Bishop's Castle Festivals as one co-ordinated package. The festivals working in partnership with the Town Council, Shropshire Tourism, Shropshire Council and local businesses to promote and market Bishop's Castle as a vibrant tourist destination throughout the year.

By working together it may be possible to develop a Town-wide sponsorship scheme with local businesses so that they pay in just once per year into a central pot rather than continually being asked for support by individual festivals throughout the year.

□ It may be possible to work with local hotels, B&Bs and holiday lets
to develop a festivals information package to help them attract cli-
ents. Perhaps we might levy a fee from them which they in turn pass
onto clients by charging extra to stay during festivals periods?

Festivals Coordinator

While it is vital to preserve the unique character of each individual festival, there are many event organising tasks that could be done more efficiently across all festivals.

It is proposed to employ a suitable Festival Coordinator, initially for Michaelmas, with BC Carnival and Xmas Lights/Grotto, to outsource many of the most time consuming tasks.

Possibly this could extend to Clun Green Man and other local festival in future years.

Key tasks

Accounts

Insurance

Admin (eg. risks assessments, performer and caterer contracts, road closures, venue bookings, managing stall bookings, managing vintage vehicle bookings, etc)

Sponsorship / bidding for grants

Publicity - maintaining Facebook, website, flyers, posters, etc

Funding

Suggested salary @ £15 per hour

2 * 8 hour days pro rata for 6 months

Total cost per annum £6,240

To be funded pro rata by those events using the Co-ordinator. Additional funding to come from grants, donations, sponsorship and income from events.

We hope that the Town Council would support this initiative with a grant in at least year 1.



Bishops Castle has been recognised by the Alzheimer's Society as working towards being a Dementia Friendly Community. (this is an ongoing process)

Several establishments in Bishops Castle are supporting the Community to be Dementia Friendly by making changes that help those living with Dementia including the Pharmacy and Bishops Castle Medical Practice where:

All staff have completed Dementia Awareness sessions.

Railings outside the Practice have been repainted red to become more obvious and lead people to the door.

Several Medical Practitioners now collect patients living with Dementia from the Waiting Room, as this may reduce any possible stress or anxiety the patient maybe experiencing.

Signage and directions within the building are now clearer. In Bishops Castle

Future Plans at the Medical Practice

Improvement to the toilets will also include clear signage and an emergency cord.

Alterations to the Car Parking area will include safer disabled parking.

Shortness of breath
