THANK YOU ALL!

This year's Round and About Walks were blessed with an ideally cool but sunny day, attracting 210 people, more than usual. They all enjoyed the new route and venue, the views, the lunch in Clun and the cakes back in BC. The only thing that nobody liked was my inventive detour at the end. I guess that, for those who had already walked 22 miles, it was a bit much!

I am in the early stages of counting the money, but have almost reached £9,000. I'll let volunteers know the final amount. This money has a serious positive impact on Bloodwise, the biggest blood cancer charity in the UK. In Birmingham alone, it has £16 million invested in 32 different research projects and clinical drug trials, which help speed up

access to new treatments for patients with leukaemia, lymphoma and myeloma. It was a particular joy for me to meet a fit walker three years after her treatment for the cancer which killed Dave.

I am particularly grateful for:

the generosity of local firms - BC Co-op, Boars Head, Castle Hotel, Ganges, Poppy House and Wenlock Water which makes walkers feel really wanted

the time, energy and enthusiasm of some 50 volunteers who help, mostly on the day

the support of those energetic people who actually do the walk.


Our hosts could not have done more for our visit, first there was the meet and greet. After our 14 hour journey, a lavish feast had been laid




before us and the wine did flow! The next day we went on a trip and a picnic to Dieppe, what a very poignant reminder of those who lost their lives in the run up to D Day.


The following evening the group were

Sunday morning was taken up with an organised 10K run or 5K walk. Our teams from all three countries joined in together to do this. For our part in the race we were presented with a cup, when we say a cup it puts the champion league trophy to shame. The cup will be on display for all to see at the Town Hall.



Sunday night we had dinner organised by the Mayor. During the speeches, yes there were speeches, gifts 'Normandie' based were presented to the 'visitors' which will be treasured. Our twinning Committee

presented a beautiful ceramic

plaque (locally made) of our Town Hall, which now sits in pride of place in the Town hall in St Marcel. The evening went well, food, wine and conversation were all three in abundance.



The next morning it was a change to the scheduled start time, the minibus needed filling with fuel for the return trip, but more important the empty area which was not taken up with bags needed filling with wine to keep the minibus balanced on the way home.

The sound of clinking bottles going over a sharp pothole was enough to keep the driver awake on the long journey home.

All of our group found the trip very pleasurable and interesting and our French hosts worked so hard to make us welcome and entertained. They are so keen to work together on an exchange of young people and help our future generations.

Affordable homes for Bishop's Castle

Connexus, the housing association covering Shropshire & Herefordshire, approached the council with a plan to build 24 affordable houses



off Oak Meadow, this will be known as **Ox Leasow**. The mix of these houses will be 12 shared ownership, anyone wishing this form of affordable home is to contact Connexus (www.shropshirehousing.org.uk) and 12 houses for rent, anyone wishing this form of affordable

home should register on the Homepoint website (www.shropshirehomepoint.co.uk). There will be leaflets explaining all on site at the development

These affordable houses is to meet the needs of local people. This development hopefully will have started (27th May 2019) when this newsletter will be published.



The makeup of the 24 dwellings is as below

- 4 x 1 bedroom bungalows
- 6 x 2 bedroom houses
- 2 x 3 bedroom houses
- 4 x 2 bedroom houses (affordable home ownership)
- 8 x 3 bedroom houses (affordable home ownership)

A community group was set up to work with the housing association to influence the design and layout of the site and the house design. The council supported planning application for the houses which was approved by Shropshire Council. The main opposition to the development was concerns about the increase in traffic on Kerry Lane.

Catering Facilities:

New local charity offers free one-to-one help for those who struggle with reading

Last year an article ran in the Bishops Castle Town Newsletter appealing for volunteers to get involved in setting up a local branch of Read Easy and help adults who struggle with reading. We received a great response from local people and organisations and since then have trained a group of volunteer reading coaches and have started our first coaching sessions with new readers.

Do you know someone who would like to improve their reading skills?

It's taken for granted that we all learned to read and write at school, and that we all have the same reading ability. However, many thousands of adults missed out on the opportunity to learn to read at the time when the basic foundations of this skill are acquired. In fact, research shows that over 7% of adults have never learned to read.

Just imagine how your life would be if you couldn't read forms or letters, follow medicine instructions, or read a new recipe?

It's never too late to learn

Read Easy Shropshire Hills provides free one-to-one coaching for adults in South Shropshire and the Welsh Borders who struggle with reading.

They understand that many people will want to learn to read but feel too embarrassed to seek help, especially if it brings back memories of their childhood classroom experiences, which is why their coaching service has been designed to help new readers feel as comfortable as possible about taking the brave step to learn to read.

Read Easy matches up a new reader with a trained reading coach to help them work together through reading manuals, at a quiet private location, at a time to suit them both. It's as easy as that!

Reading sessions last half an hour, twice a week. Some people complete the course in as little as a year, while others can take more than two years. What's important is that everyone can learn at their own pace without feeling rushed. There's no pressure, and no targets or exams to worry about.

Learning to read transforms people's lives

Through learning to read people grow enormously in confidence, selfesteem and independence as well as being able to navigate through the world of the written word.

Here's an extract from a letter Steve sent to Read Easy about his experience:

'It has changed the way I do things, my life. It's given me the courage to go out and do different things, not just reading and writing but going out on my own and mixing with the public.

Five or six months ago I would never have done the things I've done, like joining the library, reading newspapers, going on public transport and going to coffee shops and the supermarket.'




