#### A place to meet, have coffee and chat at SpArC.

We know that money is tight and getting tighter by the day for many people in the current Cornavirus situation so we are not asking you to do this. However, if you are in a position to make a donation the charity would be very grateful.

#### THE BISHOP'S CASTLE COMMUNITY FOODBANK

At the time of writing we have been going for just under two months. We have accumulated over £7000 in donations. We have assembled a brilliant group of volunteers, who either service the food bank itself at our two weekly sessions, or deliver food to homes where people are shielding.

Local shops (SPAR, COOP, Harvest, the Pharmacy, Wentnor, Churchstoke Coop) have been great at collecting food donations for us which we collect regularly. We have received weekly donations of fresh vegetables from the Little Woodbatch market garden (thanks so much Daphne and Dave). And Morrisons at Welshpool has been our fairy godparent throughout our brief existence. Tesco's from Ludlow and Welshpool have also made donations. The morning before we opened, a big van turned up and they presented us with a van load of food for nothing! And every time we replenish our stocks with an order to them, we get lots more free. We've got enough pasta sauce to sink Italy!

And, from one person in the two sessions of week one, we are now providing food for an average of 48 people per session, all of whom are taking lots of fresh vegetables, as well as the more customary tinned and dried goods. So much so, that we have an arrangement with a local organic smallholding (Little Woodbatch) to provide us with free kale, spinach and other goodies on a weekly basis.

We have had to learn a lot too, particularly about the bureaucracy surrounding the provision of food to the public. We are officially termed "a food business" by the County Environmental Health Unit and have to undertake to provide our "staff" with food hygiene training. Please don't tell anybody that we haven't quite got round to that yet!!

We have no criteria for deciding if somebody needs food. If they turn up or phone up then they get food and other provisions— simple as that. We recently asked customers to fill in a short survey to help us improve our service. Under the question "What do you like best about the foodbank?", we received comments like: "the friendly welcome you receive" and from another customer: "it is there to help when we need it". For the question: "What could we do to improve our service" somebody wrote: "more variety would be nice", and another customer wrote: "there isn't really much to improve" These answers make us feel that we are going in the right direction.

It is thrilling to see people coming in regularly who know the volunteers by name and who clearly feel at ease using our service. We are looking to those customers to become our ambassadors to help other people who need the service to overcome their reluctance and use us. In this unprecedented crisis we are apart but not alone, and our new strap line is "if you need us, please use us". I sincerely hope that people will continue to have confidence in us and that all those who need support from us will seek it.



#### Bishop's Castle Festivals Coordinator

#### Background

Bishop's Castle's festivals, such as Michaelmas, bring in significant revenue for the economy of the Town throughout the year, as well as being an important cultural focus for the community. We know that many event visitors later return to spend longer in the Town.

However, these events take an incredible amount of time and effort to run and the cost and bureaucracy involved is growing year on year. The current Michaelmas committee have run highly successful Fairs for the last 5 years and after next year (which is the 25th anniversary), we feel the need to stand down, partly because it is becoming increasingly difficult to sustain our current level of involvement and also because we feel we need to make way for new ideas to help keep the Fair fresh going forward.

At present there aren't obvious people willing to take over from us and AMP (Party in the Park), Christmas Grotto committee and the Carnival committee are in a similar position too.

We therefore are seeking to work with the Town Council to collectively start thinking of strategies by which we might save and maintain these valuable events before it is too late.

#### Coordinating Bishop's Castle Festivals

We believe that there is an opportunity to market Bishop's Castle Festivals as one co-ordinated package. The festivals working in partnership with the Town Council, Shropshire Tourism, Shropshire Council and local businesses to promote and market Bishop's Castle as a vibrant tourist destination throughout the year.

By working together it may be possible to develop a Town-wide sponsorship scheme with local businesses so that they pay in just once per year into a central pot rather than continually being asked for support by individual festivals throughout the year.

□ It may be possible to work with local hotels, B&Bs and holiday lets
to develop a festivals information package to help them attract cli-
ents. Perhaps we might levy a fee from them which they in turn pass
onto clients by charging extra to stay during festivals periods?

Festivals Coordinator

While it is vital to preserve the unique character of each individual festival, there are many event organising tasks that could be done more efficiently across all festivals.

It is proposed to employ a suitable Festival Coordinator, initially for Michaelmas, with BC Carnival and Xmas Lights/Grotto, to outsource many of the most time consuming tasks.

Possibly this could extend to Clun Green Man and other local festival in future years.

Key tasks

Accounts

Insurance

Admin (eg. risks assessments, performer and caterer contracts, road closures, venue bookings, managing stall bookings, managing vintage vehicle bookings, etc)

Sponsorship / bidding for grants

Publicity - maintaining Facebook, website, flyers, posters, etc

**Funding** 

Suggested salary @ £15 per hour

2 \* 8 hour days pro rata for 6 months

Total cost per annum £6,240

To be funded pro rata by those events using the Co-ordinator. Additional funding to come from grants, donations, sponsorship and income from events.

We hope that the Town Council would support this initiative with a grant in at least year 1.





#### Coronavirus (COVID-19)

## The following symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure.

## Fever / High temperature Cough

#### Shortness of breath

Anyone with symptoms should stay at home for at least 7 days.

If you live with other people, they should stay at home for at least 14 days, to avoid spreading the infection outside the home

After 14 days, anyone you live with who does not have symptoms can return to their normal routine.

But, if anyone in your home gets symptoms, they should stay at home for 7 days from the day their symptoms start. Even if it means they're at home for longer than 14 days.
