The Community Partnership was established more than 1 year ago to bring together individuals and groups with a shared interest in Bishop's Castle under a common action plan, planned and delivered together. The first AGM was held in May and was well attended by the community. Subsequently many people have joined the Partnership.

At the AGM, Keith Whiddon gave a presentation on the theme of 'what is worrying you? - want to do something about it'? He outlined the aims of the Community Partnership; discussed some of its achievements to date and outlined how local people may become involved. There followed a series of short presentations on a number of projects from:

Rob Rowe - 'Life on the Edge'

Bishop's Castle and Clun Extinction Rebellion Group

Inspired by the success of the action in London at Easter, and the surging memberships of Extinction Rebellion groups in Shrewsbury, Newtown, Hereford, and beyond, a new group is forming in Bishop's Castle and Clun.

Over 70 people attended a meeting in Bishop's Castle recently, to learn how Extinction Rebellion (XR) is working to reverse the climate catastrophe. The group heard how XR operates, and the different ways people can contribute. Direct action like the big London protest last month is one way, and Adam and Jackie Shipp from Shrewsbury XR who glued themselves to the Treasury (and got arrested!) spoke of their experience. This kind of protest is just one aspect of XR's campaign. The group explored others ways to ensure that our descendants can enjoy a decent world too. Everyone present explained briefly why they had come, and recurring themes were 'for my grandchildren', 'to get some hope,' and 'I want to DO something'.

Local activist Manda Scott said, "Everywhere we turn, we see local, national and international evidence of climate breakdown and ecosystem collapse. Politicians do nothing if not pushed and until now, there hasn't been a good way to push them. The Extinction Rebellion movement gives us all a chance to act together, in organised, non-violent ways to put pressure on local and national governments to declare Climate Emergency – and to act on that declaration, to move to a target of zero carbon emissions by 2025 and to convene a Citizens' Assembly like the ones that have proved so successful in Ireland and Iceland, to find a way forward that will stave off catastrophe.'

Ideas were aired for local grassroots campaigns, such as tree planting and regenerative farming, as well as a national 'die in' at Barclays Banks to highlight their continued failure to abandon fossil fuel investments. It was decided to form a new Bishop's Castle and Clun group, to build on the work already being done locally to limit the effects of Climate Change and to work very closely with existing groups, supporting their actions and learning from their experience.

A majority of those who attended signed up to help and several others have joined subsequently.

Bishops Castle SNT Team Priorities

The SNT priorities are based on where the most threat, harm and risk lies within the community.

The priorities for 2019 are:

County lines class A drug supply: The network supply of drugs from Urban areas (cities outside West Mercia) into market towns using 'dedicated' mobile telephone lines or 'deal lines' utilising the exploitation of vulnerable adults and children to traffick drugs and money.

SNT serve an important purpose as we can work with residents to identify vulnerable locations where drug dealers may try to set up a criminal enterprise and when identified we will work towards removing them. Our PCSOs are instrumental in the intelligence gathering process.

Child sexual exploitation: Child sexual exploitation (CSE) is a type of child abuse. It happens when a young person is encouraged, or forced, to take part in sexual activity in exchange for something. The reward might be presents, money, alcohol, or simply just the promise of love and affection.

The SNT will work with other agencies and departments within the Police that deal with child safeguarding. Our role ranges from educating school children around this area and also engaging with children at risk. This also serves a wider purpose around youth ASB as often children at risk of CSE are involved in youth ASB.

Domestic abuse: Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive, threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are, or have been, intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality.

The SNT serve an important purpose in giving victims of domestic abuse additional support. It may include regular visits and offer advice around safety and getting them in contact with other agencies that can help victim's breakaway from the cycle of abuse.

Acquisitive crime: Acquisitive crime can vary from a low level theft shoplifting to a residential burglary. This is an area that traditionally is more noticeable to the community at large. The purpose of this being a priority is to address any chronic issues. The purpose of the SNT is not to investigate individual cases of acquisitive crime but rather address the wider issue. For example, if we have a prolific shoplifter the SNT may look to deal with them via a criminal behaviour order. Where there is a residential burglary of vehicle crime a PCSO may attend to give additional reassurance to victims.

All of these areas require partnership working as the Police cannot resolve these problems in isolation. Our partners will be from outside agencies (Social Services, Shropshire Council, Housing associations, and retail community) and within the Police (Integrated offender management team, CSE teams, domestic abuse teams). Where we identify a chronic issue we will consider whether a risk management plan or problem solving plan will need to be implemented. This will allow us to have a clear strategy in place to deal with any chronic issues that impact the local community.

Bishop's Castle 'Georgians in Stone' Project awarded £62,500 Heritage Lottery grant Bishop's Castle Parochial Church Council (PCC) has received confirmation of

an award of £62,500 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

It has been announced that the PCC's 'Georgians in Stone' Project has received the grant to carry out various activities including the conservation of important Grade 2 listed Georgian churchyard monuments. The very special African's Grave being one of those to be conserved.

As part of the project local groups and individuals will have the chance to take part in enjoyable, engaging events and activities to learn more about the history of Bishop's Castle, its past residents and way of life during the Georgian period (1740 to 1830) when it was a wealthy town and a notorious Rotten Borough.

The new project will also support tourism activity in Bishop's Castle such as the regular Summer Town Tours. Specially designed leaflets and interpretation boards, information on social media, a one-day Georgian Seminar, and a special Georgian pageant and picnic are also part of this exciting Project. School pupils will have the opportunity to learn and then perform Georgian songs at the pageant event.

Bishops Castle Heritage Resource Centre plans to carry out archival research on the stones and the people commemorated by them through extra support from the Beautiful Burial Ground Project of national conservation charity Caring for God's Acre (CfGA). The new information revealed will feed into the Town Tours and support the production of special interpretation.

The 'Georgians in Stone' Project starts during summer of 2019 with the conservation of memorials and research activity. The Seminar and Pageant and Picnic will take place in summer 2020 to celebrate and complete the project.

Project Co-ordinator and PCC member Valerie Hughes said "The Parochial Church Council of St John the Baptist are thrilled to have received a grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Our Georgian Stones will be safe and through them we can now share our important Georgian heritage with the Community".

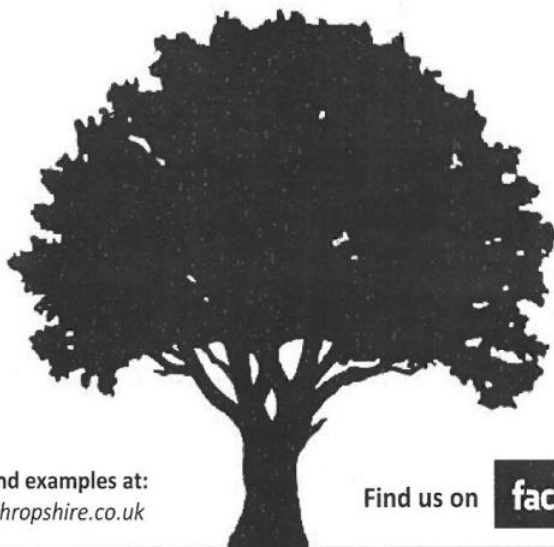
