We all missed the Carnival but Cllr Dickin and members of the Committee produced a week of Virtual events including Quizzes, Decorated Properties / Windows and a touring Open All Hours Float to promote local Shops – Those involved brought a smile to many people during what should have been carnival week and are to be commended on their success. I am sure that Centre Stages on line Party in the Park was equally be a great event. A number of the Festival Organisers have been holding Video Conferences to keep in touch and plan similar on line or virtual events to keep the spirit of such festivals alive in 2020 and in people's thoughts for 2021

Hopefully the next Newsletter will be delivered door to door for October but that will only be possible if we all continue to Social Distance and keep Safe and prevent a Second Wave.

Smartwater

Every household in Bishop's Castle should now have received their Smartwater kit through the post from West Mercia Police. These have been provided to you free of charge thanks to funding from The Town Council, Connexus and the Police & Crime Commissioner.

These kits have been pre-registered to your address so once you have marked your appliances there is nothing else you need to do other than to display the Stickers provided in the kit in your Window's. This is vital as part of the deterrent effect of Smartwater as soon larger signs will be put in place advising that properties are protected by Smartwater so please use the stickers provided or feel free to purchase some additional ones.

If for any reason you have not received your kit please contact the town clerk who will assist you further.



Bishops Castle Town Council leading the way in fight against climate emergency

At the Bishop's Castle Town Council meeting on 16th June the Town Council approved the first phase of their Climate Action Plan [CAP]. Following on from their Declaration of a Climate Emergency last September, the Town Council commissioned a Climate Action Plan report which was produced by a group of local residents and presented to the council for review in April. At Tuesday night's meeting the council thanked the authors and commended them for an excellent document before unanimously approving it and appointing Councillor Andy Stelman to act as liaison with the Sustainability Working Group as the recommendations of the report are taken forward.

'MARCHES GROW LOCAL' GROUP SEEKS TO BOOST LINKS BETWEEN LOCAL PRODUCERS AND BUYERS

The Coronavirus pandemic has shown the vulnerability of our food supply and highlighted issues of food access in a time of crisis, particularly for the elderly and vulnerable in our communities. For many, this has resulted in changes to the way we shop and eat, and efforts to grow more at home. Across the Marches and in rural communities across the UK, people have sought out more local sources of food direct from producers rather than risking going to supermarkets where basic items were often unavailable. Food producers have had to change their business models to adapt to the closure of restaurants and markets. 'These changes (and the need for food resilience noted in the Bishop's Castle CAP) prompted the launch of 'Marches Grow Local' [MGL] working with The Middle Marches Community Land Trust and Tamar Grow Local (a resilient local food network in Devon). Tamar Grow Local fashions itself as an 'Online Farmers' Market', acting as a food distribution hub for local producers. Using the Tamar model, MGL's aim is two-fold: to develop direct links between local food producers and buyers across the Marches region and to empower more people to grow their own food. The vision is a more localised food system with a stronger local food economy and improved food security, and one that is more resilient to food system shocks. For areas reliant on tourism like the Bishop's Castle, Ludlow and surrounding towns historic market towns 'food tourism' based on local produce and agri-tourism have great potential as incomegenerating activities.

MGL also recognises that a centralised online 'food hub' service focused on local food could make supporting local producers easier, and would encourage producers to keep their products in the Marches area, rather than having to build their businesses around exports and sales out of the region. The principle behind 'short food supply chains' is that by focusing on buying local food whenever possible, it ensures that growers can make a living from keeping their sales in local markets and reduce import/export traffic that drives carbon emissions and food waste.

Update on Stars shop

312 people have signed the Save the Stars petition, with many supportive comments. Shropshire Council, having rejected the Trust's request to take out a compulsory purchase on the building, has asked Shropshire Town and Rural Housing (STAR Housing), to decide if it will buy the building, and develop a small number of homes on the car park at the rear. We expect to find out what they intend to do by early August, and will then send out an update to everyone who signed the petition.

If STAR do not, the Tust will have to consider if it can afford to buy the Stars, and convert the upstairs into affordable housing, with a community resource centre on the ground floor. 

Anyone with symptoms should stay at home for at least 7 days.

If you live with other people, they should stay at home for at least 14 days, to avoid spreading the infection outside the home.

After 14 days, anyone you live with who does not have symptoms can return to their normal routine.
