When I wrote my article for the last Newsletter little did we know that we were heading into the worst period so far of the current pandemic.

The Surge in cases both nationally and locally has been significant and despite the encouraging news of the roll out of the vaccine it is still impossible to say when we will finally reach the light at the end of the tunnel.

Personally I have been subjected to a total of 19 days isolation at home following a couple of contacts testing positive and resulting in the sad loss of my father in law on New Year's Eve. I cannot therefore emphasise strongly enough how important it is that we all

With functions and events mostly cancelled or being held on line it was fantastic to see the various Christmas Lights Events that were possible take place – the online Advent Calendar, the Sheep Trail, the Town Hall Lights , the Colouring Competition, the Church Services and the superb Grotto on Market Square all lifted our spirits in these challenging times and my thanks go out to all those involved.

As we move into the second month of 2021 may I take this opportunity to wish everyone a belated Happy New Year with the hope that as the year progresses our situation improves and restrictions can gradually be lifted and we can return to "normality"

Welsh Street Housing Land Kicked Out! New Site Sought

The controversial site for new houses straddling Welsh Street (site no. BIS028), which was put forward by Shropshire Council in 2017, has been removed from the Draft Shropshire Local Plan.

This is a major success for the town but it is only the first step. The original proposal was for 70 houses, but part of that has been met by the new development of 24 houses off Oak Meadow and some individual planning permissions. The final outcome has yet to be assured as a site for 40 houses must still be found in Bishop's Castle in order to satisfy a government requirement to maintain a continuous 5-year supply of housing land.

It is 9 years since Shropshire Council first proposed 60 houses at the rear of Oak Meadow, covering part of the current BIS028 site. The strong opposition from across the community in 2012 was based primarily on the site's location west of the town which would increase pressures on streets that were already impacted by traffic and parking problems. This led to the removal of the site and the alternative being approved for 40 houses at School House Lane. This site has yet to be developed.

In the current Draft Shropshire Local Plan that will be considered by the government's Planning Inspectorate for approval in spring, no alternative site to BIS028 is being suggested. Rather, Shropshire Council has stated that the Bishop's Castle Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) will allocate a site instead.

The NDP is being developed by the Town Council taking into consideration the Community-Led Town Plan which was developed and is managed by the Community Partnership. The surveys undertaken for the Town Plan, particularly the Character Assessment of the Conservation Area and the data relating to traffic and parking, inform much of the NDP. They also provide evidence for several of its policies and for the selection of a housing site on the eastern side of the Conservation Area. With the forthcoming publication of its Neighbourhood Plan (NDP), Bishop's Castle now has the opportunity to decide for itself where future housing should be sited. The NDP will include a proposed site. It will go before the Planning Inspectorate for approval in spring when there will be an opportunity for public consultation. This will be your chance to have your say and help shape the future of the Town. Should the NDP and its site allocation be approved, this will address the housing land requirement up to 2038.

Bishop's Castle Business Park gets go ahead with £4.3million funding

To continue to thrive as a vibrant rural community, Bishop's Castle needs to attract jobs, investment and industry. This is why the approval of the new business park (on the B4385 near the Bishop's Castle vet and building supplies) is a real milestone and a tribute to the Bishop's Castle Councillors who have campaigned for it for many years.

Funding of £4.3 million has been secured to expand the Park by 50,000 square feet. This is great news for local businesses wishing to expand and for new ones wishing to secure modern purpose built business accommodation.

The news that the Business Park is finally to be developed in Bishop's Castle, with an expected opening date of Spring 2022 is a great confidence boost for the town, as well as for the wider economic development of the area. Shropshire Council is already in talks with potential new tenants. Local businesses and traders interested in new business premises, either on the park or elsewhere in Bishop's Castle, are asked to register their interest with Rob McKay at Enterprise House. Planning permission has already been approved enabling work to begin in the Spring, with a planned opening date of Spring 2022. Site clearance has already started. The development will consist of two 15,000sq ft units and two 10,000sq ft units, one of which will be split into five starter units, giving new businesses the chance to take up premises.

Bishop's Castle Business Park is owned by Shropshire Council and has stood as an unused employment and industrial space for over 10 years . This is now about to change with this investment, $\pounds 1.7$ million of which is from the European Regional Development Fund, with a further $\pounds 3.1$ million allocated by Shropshire Council.

The investment in this site is long overdue. It was first identified over 10 years ago as an essential development needed in the area to enable existing businesses to expand and to support new businesses es needing smaller start up units. Several former Councillors for Bishop's Castle campaigned hard to raise awareness of this site to secure inward investment and the development of this important economic resource for the local area. Since being elected in September 2019 Cllr Ruth Houghton, Member for Bishop's Castle on Shropshire Council, has made sure that the development of this site has remained firmly on the Shropshire Council agenda, using her first full Shropshire Council meeting to make her maiden speech in support of this much needed development and investment in our community.

Free tennis lessons, school holiday camps and attractive Taster memberships will be on offer at Bishop's Castle Tennis Club once the New Year lockdown is eased.

This has been made possible by an award of a \pounds 1,970 grant from the charity, the Postcode Community Trust

The grant is an added boost to the Club's plan to double tennis coaching provision in 2021. The Club will offer Youth Taster sessions to all southwest Shropshire primary and junior schools as well as the Community College. New grantaided training equipment will see an expansion of courses for youths and adults at both beginner and intermediate level along with school holiday camps.

Sue Cooper, Vice Chair, said "We managed to put on coaching and holiday camps in 2020 but the pandemic delayed, disrupted and limited what we could do. In 2021 we want to more than make up for the lost opportunities." Sue went on to say "Our new ideas include 'Foot Tennis' and 'Cardio – Tennis' for those who want to improve fitness. Both will take place at our Covid secure venue, on our wonderful outdoor courts. We shall also be talking to the many community groups throughout southwest Shropshire to see how we can best serve their members and introduce them to the benefits of tennis."

In the meantime, as soon as the lockdown is eased the Tennis Club will continue its Taster memberships, cost from £8.50 - £17, which allows unlimited play for 3 months. "BREXIT FOOD RESILIENCE

Over the last several months the pandemic has revealed weaknesses in the commercial retail food system and has left many families affected by lowered or lost incomes. In Bishop's Castle and across the Nation, this has resulted in an increase in Food Bank use and [1] uncertainty for the coming months.

The upcoming Brexit deadline is expected to see an increase in food prices[2] as the UK is faced with negotiating new trade deals with individual countries, rather than as a member of the EU. Supply chain disruptions are also expected as shipments into the UK are subject to backlogs and delays at borders and ports. The Government has recently passed an Agriculture Bill which doesn't require food imports to be produced to the same high standards as UK products[3].

While still in the grips of the pandemic, a January 1st Brexit presents a need for planning and preparation to moderate the anticipated impacts that this could pose for community food insecurity. The current position of Shropshire council was recently expressed by Councillor David Minnery:

"The Council's Emergency Planning Team keep existing plans under review and amend these as necessary in the light of changes both locally and nationally. Brexit planning is nationally led and we share the national guidance with relevant parties."

This response indicates that there is currently no formal plan in place at the County Council Level for Shropshire to pre-empt food-related impacts from Brexit. As a result, following the advice of food policy researchers, the Town Council has agreed to develop a Community Food Resilience Plan for Bishop's Castle. This action supports the Council's commitment to local food producers and consumers though enhancing the local food offering under the Town's recently adopted Climate Action Plan (CAP).

A typical local food plan addresses a local food system through from production, to processing, transportation, retail, preparation and disposal, based on unique local-level data. The current aims of the BC Community Food Resilience Plan involve supporting those already vulnerable due to COVID and anticipating further impacts of a potential disruption to 'Food Brexit', however over time a more holistic plan will be developed. Some current aims of the Food Resilience Plan are:

To develop supports for those experiencing food insecurity and to build a network of support so that no member of the community feels left behind should they find themselves needing help.

To work with local retailers to ensure sufficient food supplies are being held in stock in the event of supply chain disruptions.

To support local food producers and their connection to local consumers through a focus on direct sales of locally produced foods as a first port of call.

To support food businesses so that they can continue their roles in food preparation and as employers.

This initiative is being undertaken by the Community Food Resilience Working Group: Ruth Houghton (County Councillor), Andy Stelman (BC Food Bank), Mike Watkins (BC Sustainability Working Group), Janet Cobb (Edgton Parish Clerk), Daphne Du Cros (PhD in Food Policy, Little Woodbatch Market Garden), and with support from the BC Town Council.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) The following symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure. Fever / High temperature Cough Shortness of breath Loss of taste / smell

Anyone with symptoms should stay at home for at least 7 days.

If you live with other people, they should stay at home for at least 14 days, to avoid spreading the infection outside the home.

After 14 days, anyone you live with who does not have symptoms can return to their normal routine.

But, if anyone in your home gets symptoms, they should stay at home for 7 days from the day their symptoms start. Even if it means they're at home for longer than 14 days.
