The tragic events of Sunday 19th September have hit our community hard and the thoughts and condolences of the Council and town at large are with Dylan's family and friends at this very difficult time. At the time of going to print the Police were still appealing for information and we must hope that they are able to ascertain the circumstances surrounding this incident for all concerned.

With the easing of Covid restrictions and the ending of

furlough we are beginning to get back to normal with both Council Business and local events. Please continue to support local businesses who have been there for us—during this difficult time and the many local groups and events that are beginning to start their activities again. At the same time we should continue to be cautious in our approach as this virus has certainly not gone away and looks to be with us for a longer period than anticipated. Hopefully the days of "Lockdown" are gone but should such restrictions be imposed again our support network will be ready to spring into action again.

The Council has at long last been able to progress some of its projects and we expect to have a display in the Town Hall shortly with the proposed Traffic Management Measures and the plans for the Playing Fields Play Equipment refurbishment and the new equipment for the Oak Meadow site, on which your feedback is requested. Please keep a look out in local press and social media for the dates of this small exhibition.

We have taken over the Red Phone Box in Colebatch and will

progress its refurbishment and conversion into a site for a Defibrillator, we have applied for a small works scheme to be funded by Shropshire Council to carry out some realm works in the town to include the cleaning of road signs, some weeding of public areas and hedge trimming which should be carried out soon. Plans are being drawn up for the Refurbishment of the Auction Yard Toilets and progress has been made on the provision of facilities for the Youth of the Town and the forming of a new Committee to oversee the Underground for such use.

The town has also joined Visit Shropshire which will further promote us as a Tourist Destination which is now more than ever an essential part of our local economy. Recent consultation has shown that the town is now well served with self-catering accommodation but is very light on Bed & Breakfast having lost around 10 rooms during the pandemic and this is an area that we along with our partners are looking to improve going forward. If you or anyone you know is considering starting a Bed & Breakfast please contact us for some assistance should you require it.

At the time of writing this there is a Christmas Lights Switch on planned for the evening of 4th December but this will be a little lower key than in the past and will of course be subject to any restrictions that may or may not be in place at that time. Please keep a look out on the Town Council's social media pages for the latest updates.

Finally our very own Councillor Bamber Hawes is taking part in a Climate Crisis Pilgrimage from Bishops Castle to the COP26 event in Glasgow with Clarion the Bear and is hosting a short event to launch this on the 9th October at 7.30pm in the Town Hall and will be setting off at 8.30am the following morning and would welcome your support at either or both events. With that in mind I would like to appeal once again for anyone who wishes to join the council to contact any existing councillor or myself for an informal chat over a decent cup of coffee as we could always make quicker progress on our projects with a full complement of councillors.

The Old Market Square – Project update

Following the earlier article in the newsletter, a number of actions are being taken to look at ways to make the Old Market Square of more benefit to visitors and the community. When ideas are more defined there will be a consultation/exhibition of proposals to gain the views and opinions of residents.

A meeting was held with the County Archaeologist primarily to discuss the grade 2 listed Coat of Arms, which is showing some deterioration. It was agreed that it may need some form of protection, particularly in the winter months. Consideration is to be given to a permanent or removable see through cover. This would require planning permission.

The archaeologist also confirmed that if required some or all of the cobbles by the Coat of Arms at the top of the site – laid in 1952 – could be removed to provide a more level and easier to maintain surface for musicians and other outdoor entertainment.

It was agreed that the central area – with more appropriate bins and benches - should be kept as an open for area for stalls, performances and events.

The lower area could house a 3m x3m 'in keeping' pagoda or similar with seating and tables, with disabled access, to provide cover for walkers and visitors. The ground may need to be levelled. A new structure would require planning permission. The bike racks would need to be moved and possibly an area for recycling bins established.

Advice is being taken about the reshaping of the two yew trees, to enable them to grow in a more attractive manner, and on all horticultural aspects – planters, greenery – of the area.

Enquiries are being made of the water and power utilities to establish the viability and cost of introducing water – for planters, topping up water bottles and possibly a drinking fountain – and electricity for lighting and events. More later!



Bishop's Castle's Heat & Wind Initiative

The Public Meeting on 16th September was well attended with over 60 people present. Responses from the meeting, and talking to people at the two street stalls we've manned, as well as to the survey are showing a high level of support, with some objections. There have been articles in the local press and posts on social media and, amongst other public officials we've spoken to, Philip Dunne, MP, told us he thought it is an "exciting project".

We will be presenting a report of our findings to the Town Council, including the written comments people have made - both positive and negative. We are hopeful that the initiative will have sufficient support for it to be included in the Town's draft Neighbourhood Plan, which would mean that we could continue our preparation for the next stage. A full scrutiny of the proposal will, of course, be undertaken if and when we get as far as a full Planning Application. UPDATE FROM TRADING STANDARDS

Unfortunately each year, Shropshire Council trading standards receive countless reports of consumers – often elderly or vulnerable – falling victim to rogue traders after having agreed to have work done following a cold call. The sums of money involved usually run into thousands of pounds paid for work that is essentially worthless and can cost further thousands of pounds to put right.

Doorstep crime can take many forms, including; overpriced or substandard home maintenance or improvements, pressure selling (often of mobility aids such as beds and chairs), unfair contracts and bogus charity collections. Criminals may also bill for work that was never agreed to. Bogus salespeople will provide a false identity or contact information, making it impossible for consumers to identify or contact them. If they have paid in advance, they often won't get their money back.

The cost of doorstep crime is not just financial, there is also a very real cost in terms of the emotional distress and anxiety that rogue traders cause. In many ways this is far, far worse than the loss of money. There are a few easy to follow tips to avoid being caught out by rogue traders:

Never agree to having work done following a cold call – always get at least 3 written quotes from different traders.

Speak to friends and family about whether or not you need any work doing to your home – and ask if they can recommend anyone they have used in the past.

Importantly, whenever a trader offers to undertake work on your property for over £42, and the contract is agreed with the trader present at your home, the law states that the trader has to give you a written contract which contains a notice of your right to cancel the contract within 14 days. It is not sufficient to just say you have 14 days cooling off, the contract MUST contain a formal notice explaining how a consumer can cancel the agreement.

There is an important exception to point 3 above in relation to "bespoke" goods or goods made to a customer's specification. There is no right to cancel an agreement for these items – which is something that rogue mobility aid sellers are well aware of. People who sell vastly over priced rise/recline chair, mobility scooters and rise/recline beds will claim their

goods are bespoke and so will not offer a right to cancel. Be very aware of this – our advice is to shop around and never agree to purchase goods such as this there and then – never be afraid to ask a salesperson to leave your home – and if they won't leave call a friend, neighbour or even the police.

IF you decide to have work start within the 14 day cancellation period, the trader MUST obtain your written consent to start work. Some traders may ask you to "waive your right to cancel" – but, in law, you do not – you can still cancel the contract at any time within the 14 days and only pay for the work done up to the point of cancellation.

If you haven't noticed a problem with your roof it is probably not going to collapse or leak if you don't have the work done immediately – don't be taken in by claims that the work must begin immediately. Don't feel intimidated or pressured into having work done there and then. From my experience, a genuine trader will happily give you time to consider your options and take your time before agreeing to work being undertaken – and most genuine traders will have a backlog of jobs so wouldn't be able to start immediately.

If a trader knocks on your door to say they have some left over tarmac from another job and they can let you have a cheap driveway done, or any other kind of left over materials DO NOT FALL FOR IT. Genuine traders do not get rid of left over materials in this fashion.

If a trader says there is to be no upfront fees, but then asks you to pay for materials this is a sign that they are not to be trusted. Almost all legitimate, reputable traders will have accounts at builder's merchants and will never ask for you to purchase materials before the work is completed to your satisfaction.

If the price is reduced significantly to try to induce you to agree to the work this is another red flag. Similarly if the trader offers to do the job for cash to avoid VAT this is another sign that the trader is not legitimate and should be avoided.

Just because a trader is a limited company, has a new shiny van with their name on, or has an 0800 telephone number does not mean that they are legitimate. Many rogue traders now hide behind limited company names (very often limited companies that have been established for only a matter of weeks). They also will accept payment via bank transfer, debit or credit card as well as cash. We are seeing increasing cases where

payment has been made via bank transfer – but usually the account the money goes into is not that of the trader themselves.

Wherever possible, pay using a credit card – as doing so offers additional protection in the event that something goes wrong.

Look out for your neighbours and report anything suspicious to Trading Standards and/or the Police. Ask yourself, does your elderly, vulnerable neighbour really want or need their driveway re-surfaced? Does that neighbour's roof really need replacing?

My experience of over 14 years working for trading standards has made me suspicious of anyone who cold calls at my doorstep – and as such, whenever someone does cold call they are met with a polite but firm "Sorry, I never buy anything on my doorstep" followed by the door being closed. Rogue traders are skilled talkers and, sadly, very persuasive individuals – so closing the door before they start to tell you about your loose roof tiles, dirty driveway, moss covered roof or how they have some left over tarmac I find is the best approach to take.
