MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF BISHOP'S CASTLE TOWN COUNCIL, HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY 7TH JANUARY 2003 AT 8.00PM

## 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE:

Apologies received from Cllrs Lawrence, Magill and Morris.

## 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:

Cllrs Blundell and Whittall declared a prejudicial interest on items 14.

Cllrs Blundell, Carroll and Whittall declared a personal interest on item 8 (If during discussions a donation towards the Christmas Lights is considered.)

Cllr Whittall declared a personal interest in item 7.  
Cllr Carroll declared a personal interest on item 17.

## 3. MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 10TH DECEMBER 2002:

Minutes of the Council meeting held on Tuesday 10th December 2002, having been circulated were proposed as a true record by Cllr Blundell, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney, approved and signed by The Mayor.

## 4. MATTERS ARISING:

Item 9: Cllr Carroll reported that the next meeting of the Vital Villages Group is on Thursday, 9th January. A questionnaire has been produced by the Steering Committee who are seeking Co-ordinators for each street and estate. During January it is planned that these Co-ordinators will be consulting with households in their designated area to complete the questionnaire, for which they will be given £25 for their time and any expenses they may have incurred.

## 5. MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WISHING TO SPEAK:

A) Mrs C. Barnsley: Manager of the Stars Shop in Church Street. Last Autumn a skip was left outside the shop for several weeks, now there is a large vehicle parked outside the premises, often for days at a time. This causes problems for the business and Mrs Barnsley suggested that some form of waiting restriction or time limit on parking would be beneficial. Although the Council had sympathy with Mrs Barnsley they felt it was not appropriate to introduce parking restrictions in this area. Cllr Dr Penney proposed advice is taken from the Police and/or S.C.C. and we consider what action is appropriate at the next meeting, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved. ACTION TOWN CLERK

B) Dr Adrian Penney: The Council has recently considered an application for funding from S.A.F.E.R. Bishop's Castle and Dr Penney wished to express his concerns about some aspects of this scheme. The First Responders are trained volunteers who provide medical response in rural areas until the ambulance arrives at the scene. However, as well as being entirely voluntary the Responders are even expected to raise money to provide equipment. 19 minutes is the standard response time for an ambulance in rural areas, but in Bishop's Castle it is quite normal for ambulances to be outside this recommended time. The arrival of a Community First Responder will count into the response time. Dr Penney is concerned that although this service is very much appreciated, it will give misleading information regarding ambulance response times in rural areas. Also, it should be properly funded by the N.H.S. and the provision of equipment, training, uniforms and travelling should be from the N.H.S. and not from locally raised funds. It was approved that this should be brought to the attention of the Ambulance Service and the M.P. ACTION TOWN CLERK

## 6. TOWN & COUNTRY PLANNING ACT:

a) 1/02/14019/VC Variation of Conditions. Variation of condition number 3 of appeal ref: APP/K3225/A/01/1057094 to permit an extension to hours of trade (delegated matter). China Village, 13, Market Square, Bishop's Castle. Letter read from the Civic Society and the letter of application from the China Village was also read, which contained a number of inaccuracies. Cllr Wright proposed No Objection, but the attention of the Planning Authority should be drawn to these inaccuracies, particularly on the point that 'this is the main business centre and not residential'. The Square is a mixture of residential and commercial premises and not predominantly business as stated. ACTION TOWN CLERK

b) 1/02/14057/F Planning Permission (full) for erection of a dwelling. Residential Development, Love Lane, Bishop's Castle. Beeches Three Ltd., Beeches Road, Rowley Regis, West Midlands. Letter read from the Civic Society, objecting on the grounds that the reed bed area could be damaged, the amenity area lost and the tree to the west of Plot 30 could be affected. Cllr Whittall proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved with Cllr Penney voting against the proposition.

c) 1/02/14057/F Tree Works (Conservation Area). Pruning of 2 silver birch trees. Land adjoining Hollenbough, Church Lane, Bishop's Castle. Mrs A.M. Jackson, 5 Salop Street, Bishop's Castle. Cllr Dr Penney proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved.

d) No other Planning Applications were received.

## 7. SOUTH WEST SHROPSHIRE SPORTS & ARTS CENTRE:

At the last meeting a letter from C.C. Phillips was read asking the Council to consider a donation towards this Project and it was agreed to discuss when the precept was being considered. Letter read from K. Chambers regarding the inaccurate report in the South Shropshire Journal following the meeting on 28th November. The Chairman, R. Pahl and Ms Chambers had written to the Editor to express their dismay at the misleading and negative report that appeared in the paper. Notes of the meeting were also received. CIRCULATE

Letter from Mr Preshous inviting a representative to attend a meeting at the Community College on Monday 13th January at 7.30 pm to finalise details for the Exhibition of the History of Sports and Arts Groups at The Community College on 28th February and 1st March, to raise public awareness of and support for the Sports and Arts Project.

## 8. PRECEPT:

The Clerk issued copies of accounts y/e 31.3.02 together with income and expenditure 1.4.02 to 31.12.02 and estimates of income and expenditure 1.1.03 - 31.3.03. Councillors felt it would be helpful to have this information prior to the meeting in order to read and consider. It was suggested that in future this information could be prepared to the end of November with estimates for December to March. Cllr Blundell proposed this is an Agenda item for June/July, seconded by Cllr Carroll and approved.

Cllr Carroll advised that the cost of the Christmas Lights is met by the Chamber of Trade, with the Town Council making a donation and proposed this is shared equally in future. Following due consideration of the information presented Cllr Dr Penney proposed a Precept of £33,000 is requested from S.S.D.C., seconded by Cllr Pinches. Cllr Blundell proposed an amendment, that £35,000 is requested, to include £500 towards the Sports & Arts Project and £500 towards the cost of Christmas Lighting in the Town, seconded by Cllr Carroll. There were 5 votes for the amendment, 4 votes against. This was put to the Council as the substantive motion and approved.

## 9. ACCESS TO BROADBAND IN BISHOP'S CASTLE:

The question of Broadband not being available to people in Bishop's Castle had been raised by Mr L. Stanley in a letter to the Council last month. Mike Ashwell, Enterprise House has provided for Councillors detailed information about Broadband which was circulated. Councillors felt they would like time to read and consider this information and Cllr Carroll proposed this is an Agenda item for the next meeting, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved. ## 10. PRIMARY SCHOOL FIELD:

Mrs Bayliss has discussed the Council's letter with Mr T. Martin, Chairman of the Governors and Mr R. Durham, Officer for Property and Maintenance, Shirehall. It has been agreed to take this to the full Governing Body, of which the next meeting takes place in February. AGENDA MARCH

## 11. BIKE TRACK:

Letter from Mr Biggs read, following consultation with SCC and Advantage West Midlands the Council's Executive Committee have approved leasing a small area of land on the Industrial Estate to the Town Council for use as a bike track until such time that another area is available or it is required by the DC for its designated use as employment land. The Town Council would take full responsibility for the area and would indemnify the DC against any claim whatsoever arising connected with the use of the land concerned. It will be important that there is access to the bike track without having to use the road within the Business Park itself.

Cllr Carroll suggested a piece of land in the east corner would be suitable, this would have access off the lane leading from the B488 to the Sewerage Works. Letter read from Mr M. Pugh, Rural Youth Project. Cllr Blundell proposed the Playing Field Committee meet with Mr Pugh and some of the young people who would use the bike track to discuss the best position, seconded by Cllr Whittall and approved. It was agreed to meet this Saturday, 11th January at 3.30 pm on the Industrial Estate. Mrs Furber was present and confirmed this would be O.K. The Clerk was asked to contact the Insurance Company before the next meeting. ACTION PLAYING FIELD COMMITTEE AND CLERK

## 12. POLICY ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING:

Mr Biggs has provided 4 copies of a booklet which has been adopted by SSSDC which explains the recently approved affordable housing policies. Mr Biggs has offered to send a representative to a meeting to answer any questions there may be about the policy. It was proposed that the copies are circulated to Councillors and any questions are brought back to the next meeting. CIRCULATE

## 13. PLAYING FIELD - TREES:

Having had the opportunity to look at the trees in the Playing Field Cllr Whittall proposed the work proposed in Mr Pritchard's letter is carried out and the Maple Tree removed, with one of Mr Hurd's oak trees planted in its place. Cllr Carroll proposed we take the advice of the Tree Warden and only tidy up any wind damage and broken branches on the trees, but leave the Maple Tree as it is, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney and approved, with two votes against. Cllr Carroll proposed the Friends of the Playing Field are asked to suggest suitable planting sites for the oak and ash whips Mr Hurd is offering, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney and approved.

## 14. STREET LIGHTING:

The light attached to Ivy Cottage, Welsh Street is not working and it was suggested that the old bracket removed from the Town Hall is used to replace it. Clerk to contact Cllr Morris. Welsh Street is very dark as the light by the new development has been removed. The Clerk was asked to write to Days Construction to ask what plans there are for lighting on the Estate. ACTION TOWN CLERK

Cllr Blundell reported that several street lights are deteriorating and require maintenance to ensure they have a longer life. This will cost £20 per light, but in the long run will save money on replacing lights. Both Cllrs Blundell and Whittall left the room whilst the matter was discussed further. Cllr Carroll proposed Cllrs Blundell and Whittall are given permission to carry out this maintenance as and when required, seconded by Cllr Bedell and approved.

## 15. TOWN HALL:

The Clerk hopes to arrange a meeting with the Architects to discuss the findings from the Public Consultation Exercise on Friday 17th January at 11.00 a.m. Any Councillor who is available at that time to come along to the Town Hall. The Clerk will advise only if the date or time is different.

## 16. SEVERN TRENT WATER - PROGRESS REPORT OF DRAINAGE INVESTIGATIONS:

No further correspondence has yet been received regarding the investigations, but a letter was read regarding the application for first time sewerage for Church Lane, under Section S101A. This application had been made in March 1999 and a response delayed whilst they sought ministerial guidance about how applications should be determined and clarification from OFWAT on the funding of future S101A projects. Based on Severn Trent's current interpretation of S101A the application has been rejected on the grounds that whilst adverse effects to the environment or amenity have been identified at the three properties in the application they are of the opinion that the provision of a public sewer is not the most appropriate or cost effective way of resolving the problem. Cllr Dr Penney proposed that the Council does not accept this decision and makes an Appeal to the Environment Agency, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved. ACTION TOWN CLERK

Kennedy has been appointed Waste Minimisation Officer and would be pleased to visit the Council to explain the operation of the scheme if required.

## 3. TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT:

a) 1/03/14254/F Planning Permission (full) for erection of a dwelling, conversion of (existing) Bakery to domestic garage/workshop and temporary siting of a mobile home. The Bakery, Church Street, Bishop's Castle. Mr P.G. Thorpe and Ms J. Bat, 1 Hathorne Terrace, Calverley Grove, London. Cllr Whittall had commented to the Clerk that he felt this plan was an improvement to the previous application for this site. It is a long narrow site and Cllr Dr Penney proposed the Council objects because the building is right to the boundary, seconded by Cllr Pinches, Cllr Blundell proposed an amendment, No Objection to the application provided it is a condition that adequate space is left between the building and the boundary to maintain the property, seconded by Cllr Carroll. Votes four for the amendment, two against. The amendment was put to the meeting as the Substantive Motion and approved.

b) 1/03/14257/TC Tree Works (Conservation Area) Felling of an Ash tree and a Sycamore tree and minor works to 2 further Ash trees at 35 Union Street, Bishop's Castle. Green Man Tree Care, c/o Mace Bryant, 8 Lower Down, Lydbury North. A letter read from the Tree Warden confirmed she had No Objection to this application. Cllr Dr Penney proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Carroll and approved.

c) 1/03/14266/AD Advertisement Consent, display of illuminated advertisement lettering to gable wall. 29 Church Street, Bishop's Castle. McCartney's, The Ox Pasture, Overton Road, Ludlow. Cllr Blundell proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Carroll and approved.

d) 1/03/14267/LB Listed Building Consent for display of illuminated advertisement as c). Cllr Blundell proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Carroll and approved.

e) 1/03/14273/F Planning Permission (full) for erection of 2 buildings for use as a Builders Merchant, construction of estate roads and formation of a vehicular access. Land at Bishop's Castle Business Park, Bishop's Castle. R.J. Matthews, Skyborry Green, Knighton, Powys. Cllr Wright has written to advise that he would object to the removal of the oak tree, but otherwise he has no objections, Cllr Whittall advised that he has no objection to removing the Oak Tree if it is deemed necessary providing a replacement is planted elsewhere on the site. Cllr Carroll proposed No Objection to this application, providing it is a condition that there is a maximum of 20% retail sales, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney.

f) 1/03/14280/O Outline Planning Permission for erection of a dwelling and garage and formation of vehicular and pedestrian access. Land adj. to Fairfield, Woodbatch Road, Bishop's Castle. I.P. Wall. It was felt the entrance to the site is very close to the junction and Cllr Blundell proposed the Council objects on the grounds that the access is dangerous, seconded by Cllr Magill and approved.

g) No other plans received.

It was confirmed that the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Clerk have a meeting with Mr G. Biggs, Chief Executive S.S.D.C. and Cllrs Kidd and Barnett, Joint Leaders of the Council on Monday 31st March, any items for discussion at this meeting should be passed to the Clerk before that date.

The Clerk advised that Mr R. Whitehouse, S.C.C. has agreed to meet Councillors and representatives of the Civic Society on Castle Green on Thursday 20th March at 11.00 a.m. to look at the lighting and the proposals for a mini roundabout. The Deputy Mayor and Cllrs Magill and Penney confirmed they would be able to attend.

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF BISHOP'S CASTLE TOWN COUNCIL, HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY 22ND APRIL 2003 AT 7.30 P.M.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: Received from Cllrs Bedell, Magill and Pinches.

2. DECLARATION OF INTEREST:

- a) Declarations of personal interest: Cllr Carroll declared a personal interest in item 3.f.
- b) Declarations of prejudicial interest: Cllr Carroll declared a prejudicial interest in item 3.b.

3. TOWN & COUNTRY PLANNING ACT:

a) 1/03/14351/LB Listed Building Consent for internal alterations to dwelling. The Porch House, High Street, Bishop's Castle. Mr J. Lucas. Cllr Dr Penney proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved.

b) 1/03/14354/F Planning Permission (full) for erection of a dwelling. Old Brick Guest House, Church Street, Bishop's Castle. Mr P. Hutton. Cllr Carroll left the room whilst this was discussed. Mrs Thompson a resident of Coppall Paddock expressed concern about the size of the proposed dwelling, particularly the height which is over 23' and has two roof windows. Cllr Dr Penney proposed the Council objects to this application on the grounds of height. There is a step in the roof line and as it is on elevated ground it would dominate the area, a single storey dwelling would be more acceptable. Seconded by Cllr Wright and approved.

c) 1/03/14366/F Planning Permission (full) for erection of extension to dwelling. 44 Union Street, Bishop's Castle. Ms S. Cooper. Cllr Dr Penney proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Whittall and approved.

d) 1/02/14071/TC Tree Works (Conservation Area). Crown reduction of sycamore by 25% and crown reduction of 2 silver birch by 25% (Re-advertised, amended heading). Land adjoining Hollenbough, Church Lane, Bishop's Castle. Mrs A.M. Jackson. Cllr Dr Penney proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved.

e) 1/03/14359/TP Tree Works (TPO) Pruning of a lime tree. The Grange, Kerry Lane, Bishop's Castle. H.S. Ismail. The Tree Warden expressed no objections to the crown reduction of the tree in view of the information put forward. The plan indicated that the hedge is to be cut back and the wall to be repaired or removed and replaced by fence and bank. The Tree Warden advised that this is a fine stone wall and she would object to it being removed. Cllr Wright proposed no objection to the pruning of the lime tree, but objection to the removal of the stone wall, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney and approved.

f) 1/03/14381/O Outline Planning Permission for erection of two dwellings. Land to the rear of 36 High Street, Bishop's Castle. E.C. Davies & Son, 36 High Street. Cllr Carroll left the room whilst this was considered. Cllr Blundell proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Dr Penney and approved.

g) 1/03/14313/F Erection of a dwelling, land to the rear of Shirland House, Bishop's Castle. Mr and Mrs Wainwright. Miss Humphreys, SSDC has advised that the applicant has reduced the height of the proposed bungalow to mitigate some of the concerns raised. Letters of objection read from Mrs Daniel, Bishop's Castle Civic Society and R. Moulson and E. Bowles. Cllr Wright proposed the Council objects to this, although the height has been reduced it is still higher than the plan approved in July 1999, which was 5.7 metres. The recent planning inspector's report states that 'the pattern of development in this backland area makes an important contribution to the character of the Conservation Area', so it is felt important any dwelling here is not too high. Seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved.

The South Shropshire Community Safety Partnership have invited the Council to send a representative to a Basic Awareness Day to be held on 5th June at S.S.D.C. offices. This is part of the ongoing training programme to raise awareness on discarded needles, needle stick procedures and drug related waste. The cost per place is £100, but the Partnership is prepared to pay £50 towards the cost. Cllr Dr Penney proposed we do not send a representative, seconded by Cllr Wright and approved.

The Mayor declared the meeting closed at 7.50 p.m.

Living Villages (Bishop's Castle) Ltd., 5 & 7 Castle Green, Bishop's Castle. Cllr Dr Penney left the room whilst this was considered. It was thought that incorrect elevations were given on the plan and the dwellings are inappropriately high. Despite these concerns Cllr Wright proposed No Objection, seconded by Cllr Blundell and approved.
