



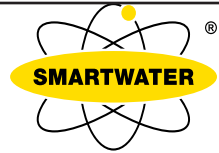

Happy New Year to one and all.

I hope that 2016 is a good year for our town and its residents and businesses. We face some very difficult times with threats to many of the services we rely on because we live in a rural area. It is so important that as a community we support our local businesses who offer such a wide range of products and services.



To that end the town council have spent many hours looking at our budget for this next year and we have tried to strike a balance between having the ability to at least maintain what we do now and also being able to fund things in the future. We are, like many, tightening our belts and trying to ensure that residents are not affected too much by a raise in the precept.

We have increased the precept by 10% this year which means an increase monthly of 77p for our part of the precept. We actually started off with a 40% increase which most councillors did not support so we have endeavoured to look at sensible cost cutting measures to ensure that the precept does not have a major impact on people's finances. I am sure residents will appreciate if we are unable to offer funding to something locally that it will be because of the measures we have had to put in place because of the cuts we are facing.

Volunteers play a massive role and I know that the community of Bishops Castle will do everything they can to ensure that the threats to our services are minimised. Our library was threatened with closure and with the help of Enterprise South West Shropshire I understand that this contract will be signed shortly. I sincerely hope that we are able to retain SpArC Leisure Centre as the loss of this facility would be a massive blow.

I was touched to read in the papers that the Festive Friends Christmas Meal on Christmas Day faced a massive challenge because of no electricity. Once again many people pulled together to ensure that the meal went ahead and I understand that all the volunteers managed to pull off a lovely celebration for all those attending.

Our patients group continue to put a massive amount of hours into the future of Bishops Castle Community Hospital. I am confident with the efforts of them and the dedicated work of the medical practice that we will have a voice in the plans which currently seem to be on hold however I am certain that the group will use whatever influence it can to ensure that we are part of the future plans for health care delivery locally.

Wishing all our residents a healthy and prosperous 2016.

The Future of SpArC Leisure Centre, Bishop's Castle

1. The problem is that Shropshire Council, between 2015 and April 2017, is reducing leisure subsidies (educational use by around 90% and leisure management fee by 50%). There is convincing evidence that rural centres with pools cannot run on this basis.

2. Popularity of the Centre is reflected in the fact that:

- Membership of the Leisure Facility has increased (7 – 2009, 214 - Oct 2013, 245 - Oct 2015) in spite of the major reduction of opening hours in 2013, so that its use is now among the highest per capita of local population in the county. All facilities are also used by much larger numbers of non members.
- Attendance at the theatre, now managed by Enterprise House, has similarly increased, from 570 in Oct 2013 to 903 in 2015.

3. Any reduction to facilities or services would affect many people:

- Primary and Secondary pupils, including legally entitled young swimmers
- users of fitness classes, gym and other resources
- the Retired, who wish to maintain both fitness and social contact
- GP referrals - for heart disease, obesity etc
- leisure and theatre employees, as well as local cafes
- those with Special Needs
- music and theatre lovers
- sports clubs and enthusiasts
- the Tandem Triathlon – unique nationally

4. Action: We have 15 months in which to respond. Action to date has included:

- a petition to present to SCC, which has generated well over 2,500 signatures
- early steps to increase usage and income (eg. by upgrading changing rooms)
- the start of a process to reduce running costs in a sustainable fashion:
 - the installation of PV panels by SCC
 - an audit of changes needed to reduce utility costs (eg. pool insulation)
- an exploration of how funding might be raised for short-term capital costs.

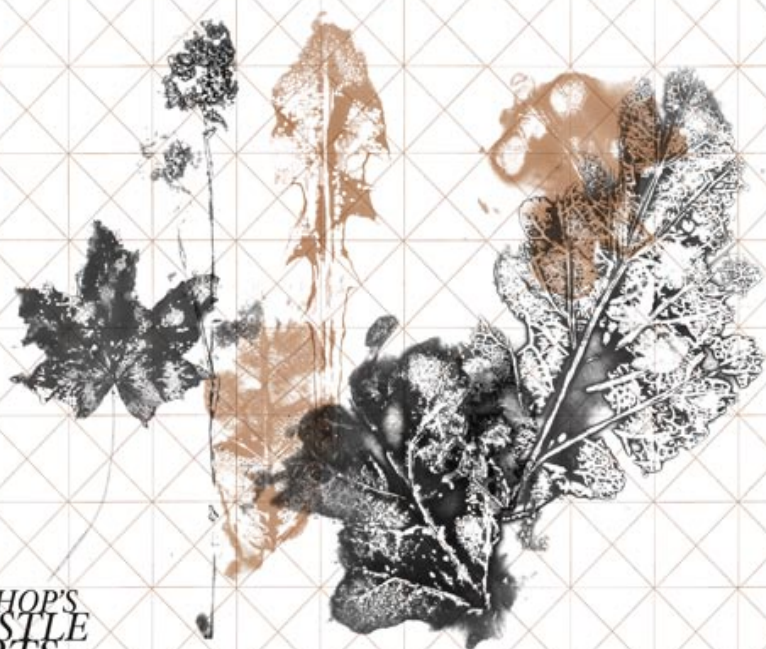

CURRENT PACT PRIORITY

Increase in acquisitive rural crime. Since September 2015 there have been 15 burglary dwellings, 12 burglary non dwellings and 23 thefts, the majority of these occurring during daytime hours in rural locations with power tools being targeted.

Local officers to target known local individuals in order to disrupt offending. Conduct further daytime patrols in the troubled areas and conduct stop checks of vans in rural areas.

RURAL CRIME

Assumptions are often made that crime doesn't happen in peaceful rural places. Rural areas are not all idyllic and serious crimes do take place in rural communities. Organised crime groups are often linked to rural, heritage and wildlife crime particularly in relation to theft of agricultural machinery, hare-coursing and cannabis cultivation. Criminals generally target isolated areas and hard-to-protect buildings looking for easily sold items such as jewelry, gardening and agricultural machinery.

We urge all not to ignore suspicious behavior and to try and report it as close to the time witnessed as possible. Many of the local burglaries and thefts do occur during the daytime. See an unfamiliar van parked in a field gate near your village? Car driving slow through the area? Suspicious person seen outside your neighbor's property? Please don't ignore it, call it in on **101**.

Ask yourself how easy would it be to gain access to your premises, outbuilding, sheds, tack rooms and farmhouses? Are your locks adequate - could they be forced? Can horseboxes, trailers or vehicles be removed easily without you hearing? Could you describe, identify or have pictures stolen property if it were recovered?

HARE COURSING

Due to Hare Coursing activity around the Bishop's Castle area, there has been a cull of Hares to discourage Hare Coursing gangs from frequenting the area.

Should any groups of males with Lurcher type dogs be seen in fields or parked up in lanes, members of the public(MOP) are encouraged to contact the Police immediately, where possible giving Vehicle Registration Marks(VRM) and descriptions of possible offenders.

If it is safe to do so, shut the field gate where the gangs have been located and again inform the Police of the exact location if known when making the call. This action will assist in slowing the gangs exit down and may give the Police vital time to arrive at the location and deal with the offenders.

The Police have powers to confiscate any articles associated with Hare Coursing including vehicles, dogs, guns etc.

Any visual evidence would assist in a successful Prosecution of offenders, photographs of the activities and/or VRM's would greatly assist with providing evidence to the courts, so any SMART PHONE photographs would be vital to ensure a conviction through the courts.

* At no time should MOP put

themselves in danger, evidence should only be obtained if safe to do so.*

Hare Coursing usually occurs when the ground has dried out after the winter months and once the crops have been cut in the fields, the sport requires visual sight of the Hare & Dogs at all times, as bets are made on possible direction of travel of the Hare.

South Shropshire is a large area it is essential that the Community works together to discourage unlawful activities of this nature.

PARKING ISSUES

We have been asked again to remind everyone to PLEASE park responsibly and with a little common sense!

We are informed that if you have parked illegally and an accident is caused due to your parking you will be liable. It's worth thinking twice about!

We are relatively lucky in this town that there are no parking restrictions and no charge for car parks - and we hope that may continue! BUT some people are spoiling the system for everyone else by parking inconsiderately.

The Town Hall is a venue for a variety of community activities and events. It's a great location for exhibitions, music, talks and presentations, workshops, markets and specialist sales. Bishop's Castle Town Hall is an 18th Century Grade II* Listed Building open to the public, providing an information service for local people and visitors to the town; a location for local markets, local crafts and products; a community facility for meetings, and events; a licenced wedding venue and the home of the Town Council.

Shropshire Council says “Bag It, Tie It, Bin It” to dog fouling

People across Shropshire are being reminded to properly dispose of their dog’s waste – or risk being fined. Simply bagging any waste and dropping it into a dog waste bin, a litter bin or the domestic waste bin is all that is needed.

Dog mess on pavements, streets and grassed areas presents both a health risk and public nuisance. People tread in it, parents push buggies through it and it is walked into houses, schools and businesses.

Not only is dog fouling filthy, it is a health risk because it can carry roundworm parasites called Toxocara. In humans, this can result in the condition Toxocariasis. Symptoms vary, depending on where the infection occurs in the body. In severe cases, blindness can result.

The parasite is spread by direct contact – making children, people who maintain grass, and sports players, particularly high at risk of contracting Toxocara.

Shropshire Council has officers who have been specially trained to respond to people’s calls for tougher enforcement on environmental crime, and patrols are regularly undertaken across the county.

Locations reported to be hotspots are targeted to make the most of all the intelligence provided by the public. Streetscene officers speak directly to dog walkers and other users to highlight concerns and responsibilities. Leaflets are also offered asking for help to report

incidents, provide sources of further information, and to spread the message to ‘Bag it, Tie it, Bin it’. Bagged dog fouling can be placed in any public litter bin.

Streetscene officers can issue environmental crime reports on-the-spot to people who do not clean up after their dog. When all the evidence is reviewed this can lead to an £80 fixed penalty notice. In severe or repeated cases, prosecution can be pursued in the Magistrates Court.

Formal warning letters or fixed penalty notices can also be issued when any member of the public is prepared to supply a legally-binding witness statement to Shropshire Council detailing a recent, specific incident.

Ignorance of the incident is no defence. People who ignore their dogs, on or off the lead, or let them foul whilst roaming unaccompanied are still liable. People who leave bagged dog fouling littering the ground and hedges are also guilty of an offence under the Clean Neighbourhoods legislation.

Those who have information about particular problem areas, times of day when fouling occurs, or know of individuals who fail to clean up after their dogs, are encouraged to let the council know by calling **0345 678 9006** or alternatively report it online at shropshire.gov.uk/environmentmaintenance.nsf. They will use this intelligence to target those problem areas and times or contact those people directly.
