SPARC SOUTH WEST SHROPSHIRE

We have achieved the following so far:

- 12 months extra funding secured from Shropshire Council
- With support from Locality an application for charitable status has been submitted
- A massive fundraising effort by the whole community has raised over £50,000
- A successful bid to Marks and Spencer's has secured the funding for a pool cover worth £12,500
- Responded in depth to the Shropshire Council draft leisure contract which is currently being amended
- Market research conducted by Community College and all local primary school students has identified potential growth areas for SPARC.

The work does not stop here; we aim in the short and medium term to:

- Install the pool cover
- Formalise the charity which will administer the funds raised by the community
- Identify and appoint trustees
- Visit other organisations to look at the structures they operate under and identify models for SPARC
- Work with the current provider TEME Leisure to improve the facilities at SPARC
- Identify small projects which could be funded to test the market (more details to be released in early February)
- Work with local councils, schools and individuals, to build revenue funding
- We are waiting for the new Shropshire Council draft leisure strategy and once received intend to work with all partners and supporters to secure the best future for SPARC

A huge number of people from across South West Shropshire have been involved in fund-raising, drafting letters and proposals, marketing, attending meetings and generally supporting the SpArC campaign. It has been a massive team effort.

Bishop's Castle & District Community Transport New £43,000 vehicle delivered for Dial-a-Ride Scheme

Bishop's Castle & District Community has taken delivery of a brand new sixteen seater Citroen Relay 2.2 diesel minibus, which comes complete with a powered lift, thus enabling the easy transport of wheelchairs.

The acquisition has been made after the Scheme's Manager, Adrian Varcoe, made a successful bid for funding from the Department of Transport. The total value of the new vehicle provided by the Department is £43,000.

Local Celebrity "Fuzz" Townshend, JOURNALIST AND TV PRESENTER, presented the keys of the vehicle to two newly qualified minibus drivers: Trevor Chalkley and John Rimmer Mr Townshend said:

"I am pleased and honoured to be able to make this presentation. I am only too well aware of how important such services are to local communities – especially in more remote areas such as the Bishop's Castle vicinity. It is doubly important for those in our community who find it difficult to get about easily."

Adrian Varcoe, who spent many weeks preparing the bid said, "It was hard work but we have had a successful outcome. As Fuzz has already said, this service is essential to our community. It would not exist if it wasn't for our band of volunteer drivers who give up countless hours to help – free of charge – coupled with the great efforts we have all made to secure funding for this fabulous new vehicle".

BUDGET AND PRECEPT SETTING 2017/18

A great deal of preparation and discussion goes each year into the setting of the budget for the Town Council and this, of course, leads to the precept request. Bishop's Castle Town Council take this responsibility very seriously and decisions are not made lightly.

For several years now the precept has been kept artificially low and this has affected the amount of care and attention the Council are able to lavish on the facilities within the town. For the forthcoming year we have looked hard at our priorities, responsibilities and assets with a view to improving, maintaining and developing all aspects of these for the community. SpArC, and its survival, was, naturally, a large part of our discussions and Councillors felt that to show their support for this facility was vital. It was also recognised that in persuading others in the surrounding areas to contribute with some financial backing for SpArC would be futile if the Town Council was not seen to be a major contributor.

We are sure that many of you will have visited the Public Hall and recognise that some considerable work needs to be undertaken to make the area a profitable, sustainable and safe space. The new committee have worked hard to do this, but the fabric of the building is in need of an update and the Town Council recognise that this too is a responsibility that they must not shirk. Add these obligations to the maintenance and development of

the Playing Fields and other recreational areas, the provision of Allotments, the upkeep of the Public Toilets, Street Lights, Town Hall and we are starting to look at an ever increasing budget.

The Town Council also recognise the need to continue to work and enhance the appearance of our lovely town and make it a pleasant and attractive place to live and it is to be remembered that we have taken over quite a few responsibilities from Shropshire Council.

All of these aspects have been taken into account and this statement is to inform all residents that you will indeed find an increase in our part of the Precept (we cannot, at this stage estimate the amount of increase that Shropshire Council will be adding). It is thought that to support these aspects of the town the community will be charged an additional 70p per month. We think the results will be worth it and we hope that you do too.



BISHOP'S CASTLE COMMUNITY-LED PLAN

Bishop's Castle Town Council started the process of a Community-Led Plan in 2014 when they asked for volunteers to be involved and a working party was set up to include councillors and non-councillors – but all having one thing in common: a love for our town and the vision to make it vibrant and sustainable in the future.

In October 2016 the working party presented the Town Council with a draft working document — written after much research, talking to the community, discussions, consultation, observations, surveys, and hard work on their part. The Town Council are delighted with the results of that hard work and would like to thank the working party for an excellent document, which will now form a business plan for the council for the forthcoming years. Some of the actions will be readily achievable, some may take a little longer — but we thought it would be a good idea to share with the community the aspects and areas within the plan that we will all be looking at in the future. These are many and varied and to get the full picture we urge you to look at the full plan — we hope, however, that this summary goes in some way towards a greater understanding from all about the areas of intention within which we seek to improve and develop.

Please remember this is a 'Community' -Led Plan and we want to hear from the Community in which we all live.

A date or your diaries: The Annual Town Meeting is taking place on Tuesday 23rd May and there will be full reports on all aspects of the Community-Led Plan and you will have the opportunity to have your say and air your views on those aspects and work undertaken.

FASTER FIBRE BROAD-BAND

Faster fibre broadband is now available to order throughout Bishop's Castle. Connecting Shropshire has installed fibre to cabinets 1, 2 & 3 in the Bishop's Castle exchange, which serve around 1,000 premises in and around the town.

To make the switch to fibre broadband, people will need to contact their chosen internet service provider to upgrade their broadband package, the broadband speeds won't increase automatically.

The work to secure the undeveloped parts of the Love Lane Business Park is ongoing. Since the last newsletter 100 business case brochures have been distributed to raise the profile of this project and a grant funding application was submitted to The 'Power to Change' on Friday 16th December. There have been two CLT partnership meetings and Shropshire Council thanked the CLT for producing the outline Business Plan and confirmed that they support the aims and objectives of the project. They now want the CLT to do more work on the financial model for the project to progress the Community Asset Transfer. There is a further partnership meeting in January and there will be another update following this.
