NEWS FROM BISHOP'S CASTLE TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

We need your help to save our club! Bishop's Castle Town Football Club has been in the community for over one hundred years but is being denied permission to join the Welsh league. The club is based in rural Shropshire, a few miles from the Welsh border.

Having played in the Shropshire league the previous five seasons the club made a democratic decision to re-join the Montgomeryshire league where they played half a decade ago. A number of factors lead to this decision but the fundamental reason was to reduce the amount of travel. The nearest club last season was 30 miles away whereas if BCTFC played in Wales there would be several clubs within a 10 mile radius.

Of all the difficulties facing grassroots football clubs there is an unusual and unfair barrier standing between a committed group of players and the field; the FA. A key reason for the move was the number of teams that dropped out of the Shropshire league, leaving a disappointing number of fixtures.

The club is lucky to have such a supportive voluntary committee and a loyal group of players. However, the season has started and the clubs future still remains uncertain with the FA and FAW deciding to refuse the club permission to join the league. Fortunately, the league is willing to hold the club a place but the issue needs resolving sooner rather than later as there is already a build up of three fixtures and it is becoming more difficult for the manager to retain the squad he has.

The reasoning for the rejected move is unclear as there is a number of clubs playing cross border football at the professional level (Cardiff, Swansea, TNS etc). Even at the recreational level there is a number of clubs such as Morda and Trefonen playing over borders.

The club is asking for support and would greatly appreciate coverage and publicity. The whole situation is ridiculously political. At the end of the day it is a bunch of local lads wanting to play football. It would be a great shame to lose another amateur club and not just from a local perspective but in the grand scheme of things; grass roots football is where it begins for many players

Community-led Town Plan Update

The timeline for developing the new Community-led Town Plan for Bishop's Castle requires that it is completed in October. It is intended that the Plan will run from October 2016 to 2020 with an annual review, evaluation and refresh where necessary.

Over the next few weeks copies of the draft Action Plan will be displayed in the Town Hall and Enterprise House, as well as online at http://www.bishopscastle.co.uk/ council/town-plan/ for public comment. The actions in the Plan have been prioritised in terms of importance or urgency. We value your comments on both the actions and the priorities we have set.

We will produce the final Plan based on your feedback and take this to the Town Council meeting in October to review and agree the Plan. Once agreed by the Council, then work to deliver the Action Plan for Year 1 begins immediately.

The success of the Plan depends entirely upon there being sufficient manpower and resources to be able to implement the actions detailed above. Several actions will be the remit of valued delivery partners, such work being already undertaken as part of existing projects. However, most of the Plan is entirely dependent upon the work of community volunteers (as was the creation of the Plan itself).

The museum is part of an active voluntary Trust (House on Crutches Museum Collection Trust – or HOCMCT) which also runs the Bishop's Castle Heritage Resource Centre and contributes to the management of Bishop's Castle Town Hall.

Our local history researches are opening up possibilities for developing the museum displays in interesting new directions, which could include focusing more closely on the town in the eighteenth and early 19th centuries. For example: we have recently acquired a Bishops Castle-made Clock (between 1724 and 1773) and a later (c1810) Bishop's Castle barometer. We are a friendly, informal organisation which nevertheless works to nationally accredited museum standards (set by the Arts Council). We welcome new volunteers and provide training and support to enable you to contribute in a satisfying way to our work.

SUNDAY 6th NOVEMBER 2.00 - 4.00 pm

Bishop's Castle Town Hall Trust has hosted many evening wildlife talks on a wide range of subjects from dragonflies to forests, pearl mussels to curlews.

We thought a daytime activity event would make a change and enable families to join in, so we are running what might be the town's first Wildlife Roadshow.

The pattern is like TV roadshows: you bring along objects of interest that you have found – which need identifying or about which you'd like more information. If you can't bring it in – for example because it is still alive: a plant or tree still growing, or it has run away, or it is too yucky to collect bring a photo or a drawing or write a description. We will have experts and equipment on hand to help answer your questions. We will also display examples of our own finds and set up identification activities you can join in. You might find out about owl pellets and get to dissect one, or, for example be asked to match a feather to a bird or a leaf to a tree.

All are welcome – especially adults accompanied by a responsible child.

If you don't learn something new on the day, we'll probably ask you to join the team for the next Wildlife Roadshow!
