

Following them was an array of floats, along with vintage tractors, lorries and a steam engine.



The Business Park

On Tuesday the 4th of July the Bishops Castle Business Park Partnership met with County Councillor Nic Laurens, who is leading on Shropshire Councils development strategy. Cllr. Laurens stated that Shropshire Council were firmly in support of a community-led development of the Business Park, and that the Partnership should proceed with developing their business case. The Partnership will meet with the Council early in September, when an investment proposal will be put forward which could lead to the authority being an investor in the first phase of the Park's development.

It is envisaged that the first three buildings to be constructed will be a new premises for Jesmonite (Bishop Castle's second largest employer), a 'Media Shed' providing an incubation space for new internet start-ups and other enterprises, and a work unit for a local firm. Two businessmen from the town have also expressed an interest in putting their own money into aspects of the Park's future growth.

Crowgate Nursery it situated on Business Park land. Following concerns raised about the state of the derelict building, Shropshire Council's legal team have served notice on the owners, requiring them to board it up, and to make the whole site secure. If they fail to do so the Council's estates team will carry out the necessary work and bill the owners. They are in breach of the terms of the lease, and are also being asked to pay arrears in rates.
