The Mayor Grant Perry

We head towards spring with a new found confidence that has been lacking for some two years now since Covid appeared in our lives and whilst no one can predict what is around the corner it is probably time for us to move on and adapt our ways. Whilst guidance and regulations can obviously change your Council will again be meeting in person and will actively move a number of projects forward at the earliest opportunity.

Within this newsletter which is a little later than usual, you will find information on the Draft Neighbourhood Development Plan and how you can contribute to it. This may be via our Website or completing a questionnaire either in this newsletter, online or at the Town Hall – the precise details of which were being finalised as we went to press so please keep an eye on local papers and social media for the full details. I would like to actively ask you to make your representations known so that the plan can move forward to the next stage.

We hope to be able to advise a starting date for the new play equipment installations in the Park and Oak Meadow very soon, this is subject to a successful application to the Public Works Loan Board. The compiled feedback on the Auction Yard Toilets will assist in the refurbishment of those facilities later this year. You may also have noticed that one face of the Town Hall Clock is currently blank however this repair will require scaffolding to be erected for which costs are currently being collated and could therefore take some time. In the spring some public realm works are being carried out with a programme of weed and moss removal, improved signage and Christmas Lights Infrastructure improvements around the town thanks to the Shropshire Council Welcome Back Fund. Work continues apace on the New Business Park and whilst expressions of interest in the units will open shortly, enquiries can be made via the Town Clerk at this stage if required. There have been a couple of complaints and objections from residents regarding this development however unfortunately the time to make such comments was during the planning process and has passed. The developers have been very helpful in resolving minor issues during the development and the Town Council fully supports the work and the jobs the new facilities will bring to the town.

There have also been a number of complaints recently regarding the amount of dog mess around the town with Oak Meadow and Church Lane appearing to be areas of concern. This has been reported to the relevant authorities and dog owners are reminded of their responsibility to their dog and of the fact that even if their pet is unattended they are still liable.

On a more pleasant note I would like to ask for volunteers to contact myself or the Deputy Mayor with ideas or plans for how the Town can celebrate the Queens Jubilee in June as we hope to form a small working party to plan and organise an event for the Town. It is also worth noting that 2022 is also the 100th Centenary of the Community College another cause for a celebration!

Shropshire's Queen's Green Canopy campaign has been given a huge boost thanks to a generous legacy from the late Richard Mayall and his wife Anne who lived near Harmer Hill

together with a stake and tie from Shrewsbury Town Council's Weeping Cross Nursery, SY5 6HT or Prees Heath Nursery, Whitchurch, SY13 2HR. Please reserve your free tree, while stocks last, by filling in the simple form on Shrewsbury Town Council website. The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a National project that the Shropshire Lieutenancy together with Shropshire County Council and Telford and Wrekin Council are supporting locally. It has been rolled out across Shropshire and the rest of the UK during the planting season from October 2021 to December 2022.

This will be a long-lasting and valuable way to mark The Queen's

Platinum Jubilee in 2022. The Lieutenancy and the Councils are keen to help ensure that as many trees as possible are planted for the Canopy in Shropshire.

This initiative will promote the importance of trees for the environment in a sustainable and relevant way and, it is hoped, thousands of trees will be planted across the county as a lasting legacy. Each planting can be commemorated by marking it on the map on the Queen's Green Canopy website

Richard Mayall's daughter Ginny said "This is open to anyone and everyone who has space or can find space to plant an appropriate tree. Our mission is to get Shropshire firmly onto the QGC map. My parents loved and valued the natural world and were deeply concerned about the loss of biodiversity in the UK. They would have been delighted to see native trees being planted all over Shropshire. We welcome everyone to get involved."


