### The Changing Face of Bishop's Castle Medical Practice

Welcome to the second of our series focusing on the roles played by different staff within the Bishop's Castle Medical Practice. Here we talk with Teresa Smith, an Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP).

Advanced Nurse Practitioners are Registered Nurses who have done extra training and academic qualifications to be able to examine, assess, make a diagnosis, treat, prescribe and make referrals for patients who present with a variety of problems. They work closely within a team with other medical professionals to ensure all patients receive the most timely and appropriate treatment.

Q: How long and how many ANPs work at BCMP?

A: The Medical Practice has had Advanced Nurse Practitioners since about 2008. Currently there are three, me (Teresa), Claudia and Sarah.

Q: What is the advantage to the Practice in having ANPs?

A: There are lots of advantages for both the Medical Practice and the patients. Patients can receive quicker appointments to see an ANP (they may have to wait a week or longer to see a GP). Often the patient will receive a phone call from the ANP, and an appointment the following day. The ANP can examine, diagnose, and prescribe the best medication. This is efficient for patients who may, for example, have a chest infection and need a speedy appointment.

Q: What happens if the ANP has concerns about the patient's condition?

A: There is always a GP at the Practice to offer further examination and advice when needed. The ANPs and GPs work closely to help each patient.

Q: Do ANPs have their own specialities?

A: Yes, they have their own interests.

I focus on end of life care (my background was as a Macmillan Nurse) also Learning disabilities, dementia and care in local residential homes. Sarah's interests are high blood pressure and cardio vascular disease,

while Claudia's interest is in asthma and chest disease (COPD), and contraception.

Q: How do the receptionists support your work?

A: The team of receptionists are such important members of our team. By gathering accurate information (although not in detail) when a patient phones for an appointment, they can match them to the most appropriate medical practitioner. This allows an efficiency of both time and skills, which benefits the patient and the Practice.

Q: How is your day structured?

A: You never accurately know how a day will work out. Each day is a 9 hour shift. The mornings start with those patients who already have an appointment, including those that need dressings or blood tests. In addition, emergencies and urgent referrals are likely to be added. I will then do any home visits that are booked in for me. These may be visits to the housebound, when I will assess the home situation and how the patient is managing. I will liaise with relatives and any district nurses involved. The outcome of the visit will be reported back to the GP. Visits may include end of life care where patients and their families are supported in making decisions about how and where they would like to be for their end of life care. I also visit the local care homes regularly to assess and treat patients or monitor their long term conditions, support the staff and liaise with family members when appropriate. I have a particular interest in dementia and am able to offer support and advice to families/carers of patients with dementia.

Q: What do you enjoy most about your job?

A: I enjoy meeting people, face to face contact, understanding the patient's diagnosis and treatment and working closely with colleagues in such a supportive and caring team.

We would like to thank Teresa for an interesting description of her role as an Advanced

Nurse Practioners in the Bishop's Castle Medical Practice.

It was a wet, grey day and a small group spent two hours exploring a local route and concluding with a plan.

Who would have thought that that simple plan " to go for a weekly walk through the local countryside' would still be here half a lifetime later?

Nor that a Bishops Castle Parish Paths Partnership group would form and get active repairing the stiles, and now gates, for easier access. Whilst others produced routes for the Walking for Pleasure series which are still a popular product from the Town Hall, Bishop's Castle.

Then, at the Millennium, the group brought a new idea to the Welsh Marches – creating the Bishops Castle Walking Festival to host visitors in our fabulous landscapes, friendly accommodation, pubs and inns. A successful mid week, mid June event 'became the standard for others following in our footsteps' says Grant Perry, member of that group and publican at the time. It carried on growing, moved to the month of May and continues with exemplar walks every year (Covid / Foot and Mouth permitting), continuing with planning another for 2023. 'Today we hear so much about the health benefits of being in the countryside' says Catherine Murphy and member of the original group ' in this case there have been social, economic and heritage benefits to the many involved'.

The BC Footpath Walking Group will revisit the original local route on the Saturday November 26th starting at 10am at the entrance of the Community College and finishing at the Playing field to meet some of the original walkers and gather to share a celebration event.
