The Town Council is taking the lead in organising Charter Celebrations for the town in June/July this year. Sunday 16th July is earmarked as the main day for a community celebration, so please pencil that date into your diary. The charter was granted to the town in 1573 by Queen Elizabeth I, creating a bailiff, a recorder and 15 aldermen, from this point gaining representation in parliament, leading to the town becoming one of England's most rotten boroughs. A New Footpath and an Improved One.

If you live in Brockton and need to get to the school, shop, village hall or the Powis Arm using a car has been the only way until recently. However, as a result of local negotiations and support of the Parish family of Walcot Hall a new Permissive Footpath now joins Lydbury North to Brockton.

The Bishop's Castle P3 team carried out the work with the support of David Hardwick from Shropshire Council Footpath Maintenance team. This involved removing bushes, brambles and overhanging branches,

putting in new gates, a footbridge over a ditch, way mark posts and signage.

In Lydbury North the path starts 200m along the drive to Walcot Hall from the Powis Arms going through the first field gate on the right. It follows the hedge line going through a small woodland and a further field to the wide track, the Jack Mytton Way.



Take a left turn here and an immediate right through a gate and over the ditch into the next field. Again follow the signs and the hedge line to Brockton. At the minor road turn left for the village.

This new path links the Walking for Pleasure walks from BC to Brockton via Colebatch and the walk that goes over Oakley Mynd to Lydbury North. So there is now the opportunity to do a circular walk from BC to Lydbury North and back with a lunch stop at the Powis Arms. A word of warning - the land is low lying and follows a ditch line so after heavy or a prolonged period of rain it can be very wet or flooded.

The P3 team also built a new bridge over the River Kemp to replace the one swept away on the Jack Mytton Way. Combined with the Permissive Path this now allows a pleasant circular walk from Brockton, you never know you may be lucky enough to spot an otter!

The Improved Path: At the latter end of last year we received a request from staff at the Pines Residential Home to improve the footpath from the Clun road through the fields to Church Lane to give wheelchair access. This tarmac path through the fields has been there for many years and there were metal kissing gates at both ends making it unsuitable for wheelchairs and probably most children's buggies. So in November David Hardwick and I removed the rings from the ates and later in the month a large group from the P3 team spent the morning clearing the soil and vegetation that had built up on the path over many years. This was followed by a well earned lunch at the Six Bells! The result is a path all the way from Church Lane, at the bottom of town, to the Pines - all totally accessible for wheelchairs , children buggies and those who find stiles a problem. Friends of the Wintles Hillside

When The Wintles estate was built, as part of the planning permission, land was made available as amenity land with some public access, for the benefit of the town of Bishops Castle. The land also provided a barrier to further building to the parth of the

building to the north of the town and also allowed Wintles home owners to 'grow their own' in the style of the TV programme 'The Good Life'. This land of 13 acres or so is known at the Wintles Hillside and is owned and managed by Wintles Management Ltd with the homeowners paying the costs of maintaining it.

Over the last 20 years, much labour by the owners has converted the area from an agricultural field into a mosaic



of planted woodland, wildflower grassland, an orchard labyrinth and separate sections for special interest groups among the homeowners. Two public footpaths pass though and there is a permissive path through the woodland. Where possible, the Hillside is managed for the benefit of wildlife.

Some years ago and as part of the BC Walking for Pleasure series, a Wintles hillside walk leaflet was funded by the town council and made available to visitors and townspeople in the town hall. Latterly, Winnie the Wintles mammoth was created from surplus brash as part of the town council sponsored March of the Elephants trail in and around the town. In addition, during the Covid pandemic, a Faerie trail was instituted along the permissive path for the benefit of younger people.

Much of the labour on the site is carried out by volunteers although for major tasks contractors are brought in. However, as the site matures, as do the Wintles homeowners, the maintenance costs are increasing.

There is appreciation in the town for the presence of such a pleasant site as the Hillside and local visitors often remark on their good fortune to have access to it. This has resulted in the formation of a 'Friends of the Hillside' group made up of a small, but growing, number who so appreciate the benefit that they are prepared to contribute financially and/or practically to its maintenance.
