

Sunday 16th July 2023

Plans are gearing up for the 450 year Charter celebrations on Sunday 16th July and the week running up.

The Charter group, led by the Mayor, are planning a street fair on the 16th, which is the actual 450th anniversary of the granting of the charter, which took the town from being dependent on the bishops to being self-governing. They are looking forward to as many townspeople as possible dressing in Tudor style and costume making workshops at the Public Hall have helped with simple solutions to looking the part.

A number of businesses have already said that they will be either opening their shops or having a stall outside their premises and other local groups and individuals have applied for stalls as part of the street fair. Stallholders have agreed to dress themselves and their stall in keeping with the Tudor theme and the advice is "If in doubt wrap it in hessian and drape it in greenery!"

As part of the street fair there will be a procession from the churchyard after the Sunday service, which is expected to finish around 12 noon. This will be led by the Mayor and his councilors and will make its way up to the Town Hall, where Queen Elizabeth I will present him with the Charter. Anybody in costume is invited to gather in the churchyard or on Church Bank to join the procession, which will take about 45 minutes to arrive at

the Town Hall

Friday 14th July – Charter Exhibition 2pm – 5pm. Mayor's evening BBQ and bonfire on the Playing Fields.

Saturday 15th July – Charter Exhibition 10am – 5pm. Afternoon tea and music in the Old Vicarage garden 2pm – 5pm.

Sunday 16th July – Charter Exhibition 10am – 5pm (closed during costume parade approx. 12 – 1pm). Street fair 10am – 4pm.

Amazing New Sculpture unveiled at the Business Park

An amazing, beautiful new stainless-steel sculpture, created by Planet Art Sculpture, has been unveiled in Bishop's Castle Business Park. It was paid for via £30,000 of grant funding secured by Shropshire Council to help bring a touch of the history of town to the site. The work is made from stainless steel with LED lighting inside to provide a magical night-time effect. It is 2m x 2m and weighs around 400kg.

Once the land has settled it is hoped that perennials or wildflowers, and possibly a tree, will be planted around it to enhance the sculpture and the landscape of the Business Park

'We really enjoyed completing the sculpture and researching Bishop's Castle history. We then created images around the topics listed below. There's an awful lot of drawing which goes into them. Everyone seems to love it too. We met lots of people as part of the arts festival who said some lovely things. We did a radio Shropshire interview you might still be able to get on I player via their site.' said Julie Edwards and Ron Thompson , 'Planet Art'.

Planet Art is an arts partnership who have worked together for over 25 years. They are predominately artists who work in the public realm, creating site specific pieces for a large number of interesting and varying locations.

The laser cut images were based on a brief given out to the artists on the history / heritage of the town which included:

Famous buildings and landmarks - Town Hall, High Street, Bishops Castle's hotel and pubs, Bishops Castle Heritage Centre, The House on Crutches Museum, the Church, railway, Three Tuns Brewery.

Nature, hills, farming, landscape, Cattle Market - Farm animals, nature referenced in the way the images flow around the globe, birds, trees, leaves, natural forms, wind pump image.

Culture, arts, festivals, Carnival, Morris Dancing - Musical images, guitar, an elephant which represents the trail, its history within the Powys/Clive Coat of Arms, and Lizzie the elephant who lived here in 1938/9 WW2, The Bedlams and Tuppeny Dish.

Importance of the railway - Image of train and referencing the Bishop's Castle railway society

Political history the rotten Borough.

Wonderful jug in the house on crutches museum where Bishop's Castle is highlighted among the 'feathered' nests on 'The Old Rotten Tree'.

E Walters trouser factory fire in Bishop's Castle.

Regalia and image used on mayoral chains.

Sir Albert Howard CIE (8 December 1873 – 20 October 1947), the English botanist who is credited with being the father of the organic farming movement and a key advocate of ancient Indian techniques of organic agriculture.

There is considerable interest in the Business Park and one company **V T Prints** has already located to Unit 7. Established in 2010, VT Prints provides vehicle wrapping for cars, fleets and commercial vehicles. You will have seen their work around – Tuffins, Three Tuns, S. Morray. 'We love it here!!' Says Dean Morris, Founder.

Because V T Prints is on site, the gate is open between <u>9am and</u> 5:30pm, Monday to Friday - so do go and visit.

Charter Oaks Bishops Castle 2023

For every single ancient or veteran oak tree living in this area, over 400 years ago over 200 hundred others were growing or being planted and nurtured in our landscape. Locally, there are still many trees of over 400 years; living emblems from the time of the Charter award in 1573. Often in isolated positions, in the middle of a field, marking a property boundary, beside a manor house or standing prominently in a hedgerow, they are delightful and always worth a moment of admiration.

Where did the other 199 trees go? Perhaps grazed or uprooted by wild animals? Maybe selected as a beam for a local building, fence, or gate? Perhaps taken off to help a war effort in a battleship or gun carriage? Recent losses may have been by grubbing out for housing, roads and to make way for agricultural machinery? Even more recently they may have succumbed to disease, climate change or neglect?

This year, the year of our Charter Celebrations, we are proposing a Project: We first need to find those older specimens of oak trees. Then ask owners of 'likely spaces' if we can plant two new oaks 5-10 metres from the established tree? Over a 4–5-year period, local people may be able to plant 400 saplings, protect them, care for them and then keep a record thus celebrating Bishop's Castle through its Charter year and beyond. In this way we can increase the chances of many magnificent trees being around in another 400 years.

Recent research confirms that trees are more than the above ground, trunk, and branches. They live in harmony with yards of fungus, hundreds of bacteria, and algae in the soil. They benefit from being near to the ancient trees as where 'the old ones' survive, so do many of these necessary life forms. They will inoculate our young saplings and the mature specimens will nurture the new one for the rest of their lives.

What next? (Look out for the posters!)

Short walks round the town during Charter Celebration week (July 2023)

Return visits to identified oak trees (November 2023) for Acorn Hunts and collection where advice will be given about germination. Discussions with landowners about the project and likely places to

plant saplings.

Selection of oak saplings from local 'nurseries' (Walcot Wood, Downton Gorge, other).

Planting, with protection, near an old tree. (Between November 2023 and March 2024)

Labelling and recording of the event.

Repeat visits, replacing saplings, repairing protectors and new plantings each autumn for 4/5 yrs so that 400 oak trees are 'on their way'.



Annual Town Meeting

Around 50 people attended the annual town meeting in the Town Hall at 7pm on Tuesday 25th April. This meeting provides the people of the town with the opportunity to ask any questions of Councillors that they see fit. In the event no questions were asked.

Grants:

Football Club (£1,000) for new metal goals

Going Wild in Bishop's Castle (£1,000) to fund a project manager to develop a volunteer group.

Climate Action Group (£1,000) to organise and run an environment say on Saturday 23rd September

Community Land Trust (£1,500) to design, build and install a new shop front for the for 'Stars'.

Carnival (£1,000) to kick start the Carnival on 23rd June after a three-year absence.

Cricket Club (£500) for new practice netting

Tennis Club (£1,000) to fund centenary celebrations over the last weekend in July.

Food and Friends (£200) start up costs for monthly lunch and social gathering.

BC Railway Society (£750) to assist with protecting and archiving original documents to ensure preservation.

Michaelmas Fair (£2,000) to kick start the event on 16th September following Covid.

Updates were then provided on three projects:

The Public Hall – Thank you. There has been a good response to the survey in the last newsletter but please do let us have your views. The Underground in particular is much loved.

SpArC Swimming Pool. Next year is the 50th anniversary of the pool and it is in dire need of a new lining and energy saving measures. A big fund-raising exercise is underway and anyone interested in helping

should contact SpArC. The pool is not at risk and this project is a real opportunity to improve it and help ensure its survival for many years to come.

The meeting concluded before 8pm.

SHROPSHIRE'S FIRST LOCAL FOOD STRATEGY and FOOD POLICY COUNCIL

The Town of Bishop's Castle has become the first in Shropshire to develop and adopt a bespoke local-level Community Food Resilience Strategy. This was adopted as a part of the Town's Climate Action Plan, created by the Bishop's Castle Community Partnership. The Community Food Resilience Strategy was developed as a response to the Covid-19 Pandemic, supply chain instability from Brexit and Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and the cost of living crisis. The aim of the strategy is not only to plan for and support the community through unforeseen shocks, but to build up skills and community growing capacity for greater self-sufficiency, improved food access, affordability and health, as well as supporting local producers and food businesses.

Bishop's Castle Town Council, along with community members at the grassroots and with the support of the Shropshire Good Food Partnership, have developed a special task group to deliver on the aims of the Strategy. The first of its kind in Shropshire, this is an example of a 'Food Policy Council' seeking to be proactive and address a range of local food issues.

As Deputy Mayor for Bishop's Castle, Councillor Andy Stelman says: "I believe that Councils in rural areas have a duty to support local producers and retail outlets and to do everything possible to encourage people to eat healthily and sufficiently." Referring to the 'Right to Grow' Motion approved by Shropshire Council in September 2022, he adds, "Growing food in areas that are otherwise unused is a good way of promoting healthy and cheap eating and would also be a way of giving the town common cause promote even greater community cohesion."

As an organisation dedicated to "Good Food for people, place and planet", The Shropshire Good Food Partnership hopes that more communities and councils across the county will be empowered by

this example to start their own discussions and strategy work on food resilience

"As an initiative, making Bishop's Castle food secure and food resilient is an exercise in 'radical optimism': imagining what is possible, rather than being marred by perceived obstacles. It is about Good Food for All: a movement that everyone can get behind - In the words of Pam Warhurst, the founder of Incredible Edible, "if you eat, you're in". - Daphne Du Cros, Coordinator, Shropshire Good Food Partnership

AN UPDATE ON THE BISHOP'S CASTLE COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP

The BCCP would like to express its gratitude to Keith Whiddon for his many years as Chair of the Partnership. The BCCP was formed as a group of volunteers to help support the community and its links to the Town Council. "Working together and working smarter is vital", says Keith.

The BCCP and has been able to achieve so much over the past several years, including research into community mental health, various community celebration days, regular social media engagement and newsletter contributions and the development of an online community Moodle resource as a mental health support tool. It has been an incubator for the Climate Action Group and Going Wild in BC, and its work on the Community Plan, traffic flows, the Town Character Assessment and the Food Strategy have had an impact on community policies and action.

We are moving into a new chapter for the community partnership and would welcome any new volunteers to lend their energy, ideas and support. Here's some of what you can expect from the BCCP moving forward:

- BCCP will continue to act as an umbrella for other groups and their activities, as it has in the past.
- BCCP will undertake the process of an updated Town Plan when called upon by the Council to do so and will work in conjunction with local groups and the community.
- The BCCP will act as liaison between the community and the Town Council. BCCP proposes hosting a series of Citizen's Assemblies on salient topics selected by the Town Council to involve the community more closely in decision making (possible topics include the future of the Community Hospital and the Public Hall).
- BCCP will continue to advocate for and seek windows of opportunity to set up a space for an inclusive Community hub focused on rural wellbeing, connection and health.

The following changes have been made to the structure of the BCCP to support its ongoing work:

Meetings will be held quarterly

The position of Chair will rotate, and will include the responsibility of organising the meeting that they will be chairing


BISHOP'S CASTLE TENNIS CLUB CELEBRATES 100 YEARS IN STYLE!

BISHOP'S CASTLE CLIMATE ACTION PLAN ACTIVITIES

BC Climate Action Plan: The 2023 version of *BC's Climate Action Plan* (CAP) has been adopted by the Town Council. It contains separate lists of actions for the Town Council, the Climate Action Group, and for everyone in the Town. 'Going Wild in BC': The final Winter talk took place on 11th May. Further planned activities include the planting of locally grown oak trees close to the remaining oaks that were planted 450 years ago, when Bishop's Castle received its Charter. A 10-day Summer Club will be run during the summer holidays for young people. It will be based at SPARC, and will provide opportunities for conservation, activities, environmental games, art, woodland activities, and species awareness, identification, and appreciation. The 'Going Wild' team, with assistance from Enterprise House, are preparing a bid for funding to continue the project. It would be very helpful for the purposes of the bid, if members of the community could give feedback via the on-line survey which can be accessed here: https://survey.sogolytics.com/r/r4pUBF

BC Community Local Food Resilience Strategy: The Town Council has adopted this document, which was produced by Daphne du Cros, making us the first Town in Shropshire to take action on this important subject. You can read or download the document here: https://bishopscastletowncouncil.gov.uk/

Town Council Carbon Footprint: The annual greenhouse gas emissions have been calculated for the Town Council. This will be used as the Baseline figure. Each year we will calculate greenhouse gas emissions again and compare the amount against the Baseline, to check that emissions are going down. The Town Council's goal is to reach net zero emissions by 2030.





MORE NEWS FROM BISHOP'S CASTLE MEDICAL PRACTICE (BCMP)

Welcome to the next in our series, intended to help you get the best out of the surgery.

Social Prescribing: Social Prescribing connects people to local activities and groups to help meet the practical, social and emotional needs for health and wellbeing. It offers a 'holistic approach', allowing patients to take responsibility for their own health, with support from their Advisor. Bishop's Castle Medical Practice was a pioneer in the development of this role which is valued by all members of staff.

Lisa Noonan is employed by Shropshire Council as a Healthy Lives Advisor (Social Prescriber) and works at our Practice on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. She worked for the NHS for many years and has a background in Mental Health. Lisa prefers face-to-face contact when possible as she feels this is conducive to establishing a warmer, more effective relationship. She is also happy to use the telephone if patients prefer or are unable to visit the Practice. Patients can self-refer, or GPs and Nursing staff can refer patients to the service. Lisa offers patients an appointment usually within a week (no longer than four weeks). Her role covers:

Health and Wellbeing

Under this heading support and advice might be given for the following:

Smoking cessation

Weight loss

Cholesterol reduction

Pre-diabetes care and advice

Raised blood pressure

Lifestyle concerns

Dementia referrals to the 800 Club

Social Prescribing

Under this heading patients with the following concerns may be helped:

Loneliness

Isolation

Mental health concerns

Domestic abuse

Bereavement

Housing concerns

Why is Social Prescribing so Important? There is a cultural shift towards prevention being better than cure and Lisa believes she can support patients in gaining the knowledge and skills to take greater responsibility for their own health and wellbeing.
