Hello from your Mayor!

As we head into the Autumn, I think the Town can look back on a very successful Summer Season, from Events to Community Campaigns!

Let's start with the Save our Beds Campaign where we got the best decision we could have hoped for. If it weren't for the group's persistence and challenges from many stakeholders in the community, then the decision taken by the board to do a new recruitment drive just wouldn't have happened. There is a lot to do, and we won't give up until

those doors on our wonderful facility are back open permanently!

We have all got to be optimistic about the future of our hospital. The only way it will work is with enthusiasm and outside of the box thinking. The campaign group are now working with Shropcom and other stakeholders to create a unique recruitment plan. They will be holding recruitment days once a month, starting on October 13th.

It is my aim over the winter to make the twinning into a group that is far more inclusive to everyone in our community.

# Sir Albert Howard 1873—1947 – a man of our times

Born in Bishop's Castle 150 years ago, Albert Howard's work has become increasingly relevant to our current problems of climate change and health issues related to diet.



As a scientist he investigated the relationships between soil health, healthy crop production and human health. He concluded that although artificial fertilisers and insecticides produced increased yields, from which we have all benefitted, in the longer term this would inevitably

lead to the impoverishment of the soil, lower quality crops and a subsequent decline in the health of livestock and of humans.

Albert was insatiably curious. Had he been alive today, he would undoubtedly have observed and investigated the changes to our climate brought on by current practices and the effect of climate change on farming. "The health of soil, plants, animals and humans is a continuous chain".

As a child Albert worked on the family farm – The Cottage Farm – which gave him a solid grounding in good agricultural practice. He went on to study chemistry and natural sciences at the Royal College of Science, Imperial College, and Cambridge University, eventually living and working in India where his meticulous scientific work gained worldwide recognition.

On returning to live in England he campaigned vigorously for farming to move away from chemical fertilisers, herbicides, and pesticides. That battle continues today. He wanted farming to be sustained by natural processes, with crops grown in fertile soil, and animals living healthy natural lives.

Although well known around the world and recognised as a founder of the organic farming movement, Albert Howard was all but forgotten here in his home town of Bishop's Castle.

The Albert Howard Society was formed in 2016 to return Albert to a higher profile and to keep his memory alive. The Society has produced a well researched book on his life and work which is on sale in the Town Hall, and there is a display in the House on Crutches Museum (Open from Easter to September). ## The swimming pool at SpArC will be 50 years old in 2024.

# Permission granted for new Station Street Co-op.

Shropshire County Council has granted permission for the development of a new Co-op store on the site of the former Countrywide warehouse in Station Street, Bishops Castle. This will involve the demolition of two buildings and the erection of a single storey retail unit (420sq.m) including installation of an ATM and lockers, plant area, creation of car parking area, cycle store with associated landscaping, boundary treatments and engineering operations.

As from Monday 21<sup>st</sup> August the call centre opening hours at Shropshire Council are changing to 9am to 6pm on Monday and 9am to 3pm Tuesday to Friday.

Bishop's Castle Allotments on Love Lane are owned and rented out by the Town Council. The allotment plots vary in size from micro plots and half plots to whole plots – all at various prices to rent. A tenancy agreement has to be entered into with the Council and the Guidelines and Policies of the Bishop's Castle Allotment Society (BCAS) direct how the allotments are

managed. The allotments are popular and there is a waiting list for plots. Don't let this put you off enquiring because plots do become available fairly regularly.

BCAS is signed up to the National Allotment Society, which provides insurance for tenants plus a regular magazine and information on all aspects of gardening an allotment plot.

The tenancy agreement and allotment guidelines are not onerous and ensure the safe and fair running of the site. For example approximately 75% of an allotment has to be under cultivation in the growing season with the remaining 25% kept weed free. Should a tenant wish to put up a structure such as a shed or greenhouse then written permission from the Town Council must be obtained. These are commom rules for allotment sites ensuring plots don't become uncultivated and overgrown or that large, unattractive structures are erected.

This year the weather for vegetable growing has not been the best with a very dry start followed by a wet and cold July and August. However due to dedication and hard work from tenants the allotments have been productive with a wide variety of vegetables and some unusual varieties, which is one of the benefits of growing your own.

BCAS was recently awarded a grant from the National Lottery to plant an orchard on an open piece of ground adjacent to the site. The plan is to plant a variety of fruit and nut trees to make up for the fact that trees can no longer be planted on allotment plots.


# Stars Appeal



# SAVE OUR BEDS CAMPAIGN—MEETING REPORT

At a packed meeting on 7th September, on what was probably the hottest day of the year, a silent audience watched and listened carefully to the debate by Board members of Shropshire Community Trust (Shropcom).

After nearly 2 hours the Board made the decision that a further recruitment campaign should be undertaken to try to reopen the beds. Unfortunately, there have been some mixed messages with the CEO saying that if the recruitment plan and activity does not result in the numbers and type of staff required then Shropcom

will proceed with serving notice to Shropshire NHS Telford and Wrekin to withdraw from the inpatient bed service.

The focus now has to be on an innovative and creative recruitment plan and campaign, developed with local stakeholders and the wider community, to attract and retain the skill mix of staff that is needed.

It will be the job of the Town Council, our County Councillor, and the Save our Beds Campaign Group to hold Shropcom to account and make sure that the best recruitment campaign possible is undertaken to attract the staff we need to work at our community hospital.

# Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams are keeping your streets safe

Delivery on calls for a more visible and accessible police force, Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion has funded 55 officers to be recruited across five Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams (NCFTs) across the force area - with a sergeant leading a team of constables - in each of the Local Policing Areas (LPAs).

The NCFTs will be working hard to keep persistent offenders off the streets and reduce levels of high impact crimes such as anti-social behaviour, drugs, major thefts, and criminal damage.

South Worcestershire and Shropshire are both leading the way with the new teams in place now and already supporting the important work of our Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNTs), Problem Solving Teams, Roads Policing, Proactive Teams and, of course, the wider force.

The teams for Herefordshire, North Worcestershire and Telford will be in place from September.

**PCC John Campion said:** "I am delighted to see two new Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams already serving the communities of South Worcestershire and Shropshire, with three more to follow in September covering the whole of West Mercia.

"Following my investment which has seen officer numbers reaching record levels in West Mercia, these first-of-a-kind teams in West Mercia will be fast-responsive units working in the heart of communities tackling the issues that matter to you.

"The teams are another example of my commitment to listen and deliver on your calls for more visible and accessible police officers, as I continue to ensure your police force has the resources and tools it needs to deliver a more secure West Mercia, as set out in my Safer West Mercia Plan."
