AN UPDATE ON THE FOODBANK

Many readers of this Newsletter will know that we, the Bishop's Castle Foodbank have now acquired the building behind STARS which will, in time, be the permanent home of the Foodbank. The BC Community Land Trust has worked tirelessly on our behalf for the past couple of years to achieve this on our behalf. But to make it fit for its future purpose we need to do a great deal of work on both the outside and the interior. This will help us to serve the increasing number of customers within our local area. We currently provide food and other supplies to an average of 113 people a week, representing about 50 households.

A whole range of people use our services. We help young families who, because of unforeseen circumstances are needing help through a difficult patch. We help individuals who, perhaps through a series of misfortunes, find themselves unable to put a regular meal on their table. We help people who, through ill health find that they cannot work for a time. It only takes a small change in circumstances to create a tipping point that can result in an individual being unable to afford the basics - it could be any one of us, and that's why we ask for donations. A one-off payment really helps us meet our weekly shopping bill. If you feel able to make a regular small donation that helps us even more.

Union Street traffic

There are increasing concerns by local residents about the speed of traffic in Union Street (and Main Street/High Street), with cars and other vehicles appearing to go at speeds in excess of 40mph. Many residents, often vulnerable adults, live in the 'shuts' or care homes that open directly on to Union Street.

'The top of Union St is a particular problem – it is clearly not built for vehicles and the turn-in/out from Market Square/Welsh St is extremely tight. Cars regularly approach at far too much speed. Cars either overspeed to get up the hill or pick up speed coming down it.'

A number of options continue to be considered – such as speed bumps or other restrictions. One-way systems have a reputation to increase traffic speeds. A 20mph limit is planned for the town.

If you are driving around Bishop's Castle, <u>please</u>, <u>please</u> watch your speed. Thank you.

The **EV charging points in Harley Jenkins Street** car park often appear to be blocked. Could those using the charging points move their vehicles once topped up. Thank you.

MORE NEWS FROM BISHOP'S CASTLE PATIENTS GROUP

SURGERY INFORMATION

The Patients Group has been interviewing staff at the surgery to help patients know the best person to contact. Our latest interview has been with **Sarah Bevan**, the **Practice Manager**.

Sarah's title is short, but her responsibilities are wide ranging, she does stress however that she is well supported by the whole team at the practice.

Some of her responsibilities are the management of:

- Clinical and non-clinical staff. The surgery has 21 staff in total.
- Rostas to ensure that adequate staff are available for all areas.
- Funding. Making sure that all relevant claims have been made. Help is received from the PCN (Primary Care Network) and ICB (Integrated Care Board) regarding grants that may be available.
- Building maintenance. This currently this includes the installation of a new phone system. This follows an NHS directive for all practices to have a VOIP (Voice over internet Protocol) system.

Sarah also considers it important to be available to support all staff, whether their problem is directly related to work matters or not.

We got an update on current matters at the surgery, these include:

The waiting time for non-urgent appointments is expected to be no more than 2 weeks.

Wherever appropriate, face to face appointments will be made. PLEASE do not leave urgent medical issues until a Friday afternoon if at all possible. The sooner you contact the practice, the more options are available for staff to help you.

- Telephone consultations are popular with patients and help with availability of appointments so do use these when suitable.
- District Nurses attend the full clinical staff meeting when they can, helping to optimise communications about patients.
- Ambulances. Regrettably the shortage of ambulances means that the waiting times are longer than we would like them to be. If you need emergency medical assistance, call 999 and follow the advice of the call handlers. They may advise you that it would be quicker to attend A&E yourself, rather than wait for an ambulance. This is not a satisfactory solution but is a national problem.
- Dr Penney has retired as a partner but is still working at the surgery. There will be a celebration of his work for the community later in the year.
- Medical problems have resulted in Dr Gardner sadly leaving.
- Current partners are Dr Tom Davies and Dr Marwan Al-Nasiri. Dr Laura Land and Dr Catherine Goodwin are salaried GPs at the practice and regular locums are used when needed.
- The practice will shortly be starting the recruitment process for a new GP.

Sarah would like you all to know that she is happy to be first point of contact for patients as well as staff. This can be for compliments, complaints, or suggestions. As she is not always available, it is advisable to call and make an appointment to avoid being disappointed.

Also, for those who have difficulty with online access do please contact the practice as they are more than happy to help.

Above all Sarah wanted us to thank all patients for their consid-

eration and support of the team at the practice. The last survey showed 91% satisfaction with the overall service provide which is way above the national average of 71%. Sarah Wood and Christine Williams

Going Wild in Bishop's Castle gets £238,000 Lottery grant

Going Wild in Bishop's Castle as been awarded £238,000 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund to hire staff as coordinators to support the community to develop and implement local wildlife and nature projects.

The group has been working with community groups over the last two years with a range of wildlife and nature projects in and around Bishop's Castle, focused on the ecological management of local land.

Projects have included building and installing swift boxes and establishing meadowlands on local properties. Going Wild in Bishop's Castle has become known for its winter talks and summer activities series. The 'Going Wild Kid's Club' provides an extracurricular outdoor education and bushcraft club for young people in the community.

Bernard Edwards, chair of the Going Wild in Bishop's Castle Steer-

ing Group said: "Thanks to The National Lottery Players and everyone who has supported us in the winter talks series and the summer activities. We look forward to working with the fantastic community of Bishop's Castle."

The grant, secured with help from Enterprise House, will allow Going Wild in Bishop's Castle to hire a part-time coordinator and a part-time assistant to support the development, delivery and monitoring of local biodiversity projects.

"This will help us increase wildlife locally and share our activities with a wider audience to showcase the potential of community-level rewilding. Above all, this is about joining the people of Bishop's Castle to learn together and celebrate our landscape through embracing nature," said Bernard.

Town councillor Grant Perry said "The town council is delighted to have supported and continues to support Going Wild in Bishop's Castle. This project helps us contribute to the town's Climate and Nature Recovery Plan."

Heat and Wind Project gets Wind in its Sails

The Bishop's Castle Wind Turbine – powered Community Heat Project has been awarded a substantial grant to carry out further studies. The work will include Ecology and Technical studies, obtaining 'expressions of interest from the town – including the Community College and SpArC, who wish to be connected to the network. The £100,000 grant, which comes from the Government Community Energy Fund has been awarded to Shropshire and Telford Community Enterprises in partnership with Bishops' Castle based Light Foot Enterprises.

Mike Watkins, Light Foot's local co-ordinator added, 'there's a mountain of detailed work to be done on this complex project which requires the involvement of a wide range of experts. The work is planned to be completed by the end of this year. Our first step will then be to present it to the Bishop's Castle community before we submit a planning application for the wind turbine.'

High Street and Market Place to be resurfaced

Shropshire Highways is currently planning for High Street and Market Place. The schemes have been identified as needing essential maintenance.

The works will involve the following activities:

Removal of studs and or other street furniture (as required by the design).

Planning out the existing surface to various depths (as required by the design) and dispose of the arisings.

Laying the new surface to various depths – (as required by the design) and then allowing it to set/ cure before traffic is allowed over it.

Laying down new road markings.

Resurfacing is a vital part of highways maintenance; and a key investment on behalf of Shropshire Council to improve the long-term condition of the network, help to prevent structural problems in the future and reduces time spent on smaller repairs, such as filling potholes.

Dates are not yet programmed in, however, the plan is to do this scheme between April 24 and March 25. Thoughts and feedback are welcomed

To ensure these works are delivered in the most efficient and safest manner for both the public and our workforce, a road closure is typically required. A signed diversion route will be in place, all vehicles would be required to follow this.

Note - A reminder that roads needing repair can be logged easily and quickly along with photographs on FixMyStreet

Hospital up date: This Newsletter will be out before any decision is made but huge thanks are due to Jenny Sergeant, and everyone else - whatever the outcome.

Bishops Castle Civil Defence Bowling Club

The club has recently advised the Town Council that due to a lack of members (9 currently) that they have folded. The Town Council has and continues to pay the electricity bill at the club and it has been suggested that the Council take over responsibility for the ground and facilities on the site once the members have removed any articles that they wish to. The site consists of a Bowling Green and 3 Buildings - one storage shed, one Portakabin clubhouse and one other wooden shed (to which access has yet to be provided) and is accessed via a gate at the top of the Grange Road entrance to the Playing Fields. The ground is leased on a peppercorn rent from Living Villages Trust - who may or may not still be in existence and has electricity and water to site. There is a toilet that may be connected to mains drainage but further investigation is required. There 4 floodlights for the Green -2 of which are currently facing the playing fields. The buildings and open space could be used in the short term for the Youth Project and storage whilst longer term and subject to legal checks as to the ownership of the land and planning regulations the plot could be developed for alternative use such as Youth Facilities / Club or a Community Room / New Public

Hall. It is proposed that the Council offer to take on the running of the facility, in the short term, this may be to allow continued use of the green for Bowling or in the longer term for possible alternative uses..

Council Tax 2024/25

You will shortly be receiving your Council Tax Bill for 2024/2025 which includes a precept for Bishops Castle Town Council which is how our services are funded. The Council deliberated for many hours whilst setting the new precept conscious of the current cost of living crises as well as the fact that last year saw a small reduction. However we, as a Council, are not exempt from the pressure of increasing costs and have seen considerable increases in energy, wages and salaries and contractors charges throughout the last 12 months. The effect of all these have seen our reserves being required to a far larger extent than envisaged.

Unlike other town councils such as Church Stretton, Ludlow and Shrewsbury where new properties being built provide new additional income by increasing the tax base upon which the burden falls, we in Bishops Castle are under a moratorium restricting development due to the issue of development in the River Clun Catchment area and the pollution it may cause. Therefore new building is not currently permitted and the tax base remains static and the burden of increased costs falls on the same number of properties year after year.

The council has committed to improving facilities and services it provides and has in recent years refurbished both play areas, installed LED lighting, supported the Charter Celebrations and repaired the Town Hall Clock.

In the future we are helping to :

match fund grant applications for the Pump Track

improve the Skatepark

refurbish the Auction Yard Toilets,

support SpArC and local tourism and festivals

Going Wild,

the Heat Network

and reduce the Town's Carbon Footprint all of which incur costs.

Unfortunately all of these come at a cost and you will therefore note an increase in our proportion of the council tax next year of £3.82 per property per month which equates to 88 pence per week. However we can assure you that every penny raised by Bishops Castle Town Council will be spent locally to improve services and infrastructure in the town for the benefit of its residents

Bishop's Castle Allotment Society

National Lottery funded Community Orchard Project

Bishop's Castle Allotment Society recently received a grant from the national lottery to plant an orchard on the land owned by Bishop's Castle Town Council adjacent to the allotment site on Love Lane.

The area has now been planted with 16 fruit and nut trees, including cooking and eating apple, pear, plum, damson, medlar, quince, mulberry and cobnut. The varieties were carefully selected according to size, climate, pollination requirements, fruit productivity and uses/ taste. The trees are well-protected from rabbit and vole damage! Hopefully in two or three years time some of the trees will be producing fruit.

The Allotment Society will be assisted with the ongoing orchard area management by Bishop's Castle Going Wild Group.



Litter Picking

Would you like to help keep our lovely little town looking tidy?

There is a small, friendly and dedicated team of volunteer litter pickers who meet regularly to help make this happen and there is always room for more helpers. Black bin liners, high vis jackets and pickers are provided by the town council. You will need to bring your own gloves.
