The performances of Oliver Morgan (picture on the front Cover) have filled the whole town with pride and the Fan Park Events were well supported and helped raise funds for the Swimming Pool. We are grateful to all the local businesses that supported the Big Screen and Fan Park and those responsible for organising the event that lasted a week in the end and has raised in excess of £5,000 for the Sparc Pool at 50 Campaign.

Ollie recorded 53.44 in his 100mtr Backstroke hear and improved this to 52.85 to qualify for the final where despite improving his time again to 52.84 he finished outside the Medals.

He qualified for the 200mtr Backstroke semi-final with a time of 1.57.56 and again improved his time to 1.57.28 but failed to qualify for the final. His time in the 100mtr Backstroke meant that he was

included in the 4x100mtre Medley Relay with Adam Peaty, Matt

Richards and Joe Lichfield where their time of 3.32.13 saw them qualify for the final. In the final they were pipped to the podium and finished in 4th place.

Road Closures

Salop Street 5th – 13th August Highway drainage infrastructure repairs on Salop Street. During the period of these works Salop Street will be closed to traffic and no parking will be permitted along Salop Street. The Council will work with local businesses to allow any deliveries required but there may be some time delays during the working day 09.00 to 16.00. The 'no parking' will be enforced 24hrs per day to prevent delays in the works.

Defibrillators.

Recently the defibrillators in the town have been used quite regularly. They have proved there worth. There are concerns however that many people have no idea how many there are in Bishop's Castle or where they are located – and if they are located in the right places. When they are needed it is imperative that they can be accessed quickly. A 999 call would be required in order to access the defibrillators; this could be made on route.

Below are details and a map of the publicly accessible defibrillators in Bishop's Castle. These are available 42/7. This map is also in the Town Hall and on public notice boards. There are other defibrillators in the town but these are in private premises therefore have not been included as not available at all times.



This exercise has shown that there is a need for an additional defibrillator at the top of the town. Possible locations are being considered in the Market Place, The Wintles, Welsh Street area. Once in place training will be offered on this particular model.

There is also nervousness about the idea of using a defibrillator without advance training. Although the principles are the same there are differences between various 'makes'. Each defibrillator gives instructions for its particular use, which we are assured are clear and simple.

The town does need more 'first responders' and in future defibrillator training will be part of their induction. If you would like to become a first responder please contact the clerk on 01588 638141 or at town-clerk@bishopscastlerowncouncil.gov.uk

There appears to be no pubic register of defibrillators with various organisations installing and maintaining their products. Obtaining grants is also difficult as , including 'private' defibrillators, per capita the town is already well served.

a Memorial Plaque at the Town Hall on Friday 14th June to Sir Albert Howard, the 'father of modern organic agriculture'. Albert Howard was born in Bishop's Castle in 1873. Green Bins and Craven Arms Recycling centre

From 1 October 2024 we will all need to subscribe to Shropshire Council's garden waste collection service if we want the Council to continue emptying our green garden bins.

The annual subscription fee is £56 and will cover the period for 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025. A payment window will be open from September 2024 until 31 March 2025. The charge is £56 regardless of when we sign up.

Once we have signed up and paid, the Council will empty our garden waste on our scheduled collection day. However, if this is after the 1 October 2024 the later you leave it to subscribe the higher the chance that your collection day will change.

If you don't subscribe, they won't empty your garden bin after 1 October 2024.

From this date food waste collections will be suspended and will no longer be able to put food waste in our garden bins.

as councils cannot charge for this service. However, all councils in

England must introduce a weekly food waste collections to all properties in 2026 and Shropshire will introduce a new food waste collection service by this date.

Meanwhile all five recycling centres including Craven Arms are set to remain open but close one day a week to help make the required savings. This is most likely to be on a Wednesday or Thursday – the least popular days for visitors – with a final decision to be made in conjunction with the council's waste contractor Veolia.

Cabinet has also agreed a new booking system for the recycling centres, which will help to reduce queues at busy times and encourage more recycling by enabling centre staff to better engage with visitors

THE POOL AT 50 HALF-TIME SCORE

On June 30, we were half-way through the pool's 50th birthday year. Our end-of-year target is for £250,000 to replace it sustainably. We started with £70,000 in November 2023 from previous Community fundraising. By the end of June 2024, this had grown to £162,000! This is a brilliant achievement, thanks to all of you, but we need your help again. By the end of 2024, we need a further £90,000.

We had the amazing opportunity to raise funds by having Oliver Morgan as our own Olympic swimmer. Ollie is a graduate of the Community College, was taught to swim in SpArC by one of our trustees. He also worked as a lifeguard at SpArC. What better proof is there of the impact of our pool?

The Community Day was held on Sunday 28th July (just as the newsletter was going to press) celebrated Ollie's achievement when he made it the Olympic final. His races were shown on a big screen live from Paris, and the town cheered him on enabling us to gener-

ate money for the SpArC Pool

The High Sheriff, who launched the campaign, was with us here to wish us well. SpArC was open the whole day, with activities in the pool, theatre and gym. There were a variety of sports, other events, food and drink on offer outside, along with the big screen but this could only happen with your support.

The Herbert Protocol

Three people with dementia have gone missing in Bishop's Castle in the last month – all eventually found safely. Caring for vulnerable

people, including those with dementia or Alzheimer's, can be challenging. Sometimes people start to wander and either lose their bearings, or lose track of time and stay away longer than expected. Planning ahead to keep them safe is really important. The Herbert Protocol is a form that carers, family or friends of a vulnerable person, or the person themselves can fill in, print and keep somewhere safe (and securely) in the house. Changes at the House on Crutches Museum

If you haven't visited the House on Crutches Museum recently, or even if you have, then a return visit will reveal some alterations and additions.

The informative Timeline in the Entrance Room has now been completed and illustrates how Bishop's Castle may have evolved from pre-history times to the present day. There are several new displays, both upstairs and downstairs, including one about the creation of the museum, and a revamp of the Town Room, with greater emphasis on Droving which has been such a powerful influence on the development of the town. Children from the Robins class at the Primary School have provided some excellent animal art work to illustrate this. Four new collections are on display in the Agricultural Room and a collection of sewing, embroidery and related handicrafts, has been installed in the Parlour, which also offers a toy cupboard for children and a selection of clothes for both old and young to dress up in. Following the successful Easter Egg Trail at the end of March, there

is now another activity for our younger visitors. The Piggies Trail has been devised to help locate 10 pigs which escaped from Dai the Drover when being taken to market. They are hiding in the museum and if you can find all 10 of them, you'll be rewarded!



Around the museum you will come across watercolour paintings. These are the result of opening the museum to a group of amateur



artists. On four successive Monday mornings in June, the participants came to paint or draw artefacts, or other aspects of the museum. It is hoped to repeat this successful event, 'Art in the Museum', possibly in October, so if you are interested do contact me. See below for my contact details.

The House on Crutches is open to visitors, from March 29th to the end of September, on Saturday and Sunday afternoons from 1.30pm to 4.30pm, with additional openings on the Mondays and Tuesdays of Bank Holiday weekends, as well as from 11am to 5pm on 21st September (Michaelmas Fair Day). Entry to the museum is free but it relies on visitor donations, as well as income from group visits and initiatives such as 'Art in the Museum', to keep it going. Volunteers steward the museum when it is open, covering three or four sessions in the season, and enjoying meeting visitors and talking to them about the town and the museum. 

2024 ROUND AND ABOUT WALKS

222 people signed up for this year's walk – exactly the same as last year. We have collected £2,640 which, when Gift Aid has been claimed, will total well over £3,000 for the Community College and Blood Cancer charities.

As normal, the total circuit was 23 miles, divided between 7 maps so that much shorter distances can be followed, given either the bus or two cars. For the first time, we offered two short circular walks and will add another two next year.

We received many appreciative comments, both about the route itself and its marking – which seems to be almost unique.

Next year, the walks will run from May 19 to June 2, 2025. If you have any thoughts or suggestions for improvement or just change, please let me know.

In particular, I'd like to know of anywhere in BC where people can have tea after 4pm. With the very honourable exception of the Castle, this is a problem which we don't meet in Clun. Thank you!


