The shorter days and the longer nights, naturally, not only give me much more time to reflect on the months just gone but also to prepare for the months ahead when Springtime arrives.

I'll start by recognising how close the 'Save the SpArC Pool' at 50 Campaign efforts are, getting ever closer the £250k target. Through hard work, determination and collaboration, they are day by day, getting to that huge milestone needed to get on with the work. Keep an eye out for more events. SpArC is hosting or joining forces with other fund raising efforts to get the total over the line.

The 'Bonfire & Fireworks' night, I have to say, was once again a great success. Over £3,000 was raised to be shared between 'Save the SpArC' and 'Party in the Park'. I do hope that bonfire night continues to be a mainstay in the town's event calendar and we can make this event even more special in years to come. Once again, without volunteers, this event wouldn't have taken place, so thank you!

Casting our minds back to the rain/storms in October, we,

as a community struggled, with properties in Colebatch being flooded and, out of the parish, parts of South West Shropshire being badly affected. Cllr Houghton and I are going to look into forming a flood watch group. I am also very actively working on an emergency action plan for the Town, which will help us to be more resilient and identify problems before it's too late.

As you will all mostly know, the oil leak at the top of the town has been somewhat a mystery. Still, to this day, almost a month after the leak started, we are no nearer to finding the source. Two things have come out of this. Firstly, a massive thank you to those members of the community and businesses who have helped each other out and tried to get to the bottom of the problem, after pretty much being abandoned by strategic partners. And also, to anyone in Town with an oil tank, please check your tank and oil line regularly, so we can avoid another incident like this in the future.

Just a quick update on the War Memorial. A letter has been sent to the Chancellor at Lambeth Palace, London with all the necessary information and details provided of what had been requested to do the gentle conservation works on the memorial. A date is tentatively in the diary for early spring.



It was a great turnout for the Town's Remembrance Sunday parade and service. It's great to have the Town Band playing in the parade, and also to see so many members of different generations of the community out to remember our fallen heroes.

Another quick update on Shropshire Council. Things aren't really getting much better and there is a concern with regard to the finances of Shropshire Council and how they will affect the Town. Even the simplest of things like streetlights not working are said to be put on the back burner due to limited finances. We will keep the pressure on to get what's best for our communities in rural Shropshire.

Lastly but not least, we will be celebrating the switching on of our 'Christmas Lights' on Saturday 7th December. Please come out to support this event and celebrate. And once again, a big thank you to those volunteers who have helped to put them up or to plug them in for us all to enjoy.

Business Park – progress

There is continuing interest in the activity on the Business Park. Progress is being made.

Shropshire Council confirmed that rents for the Bishops Castle Business Park are deemed to be a fair market value for the area and quality of the development, given that this is brand new, Grade A construction with renewable features such as solar panels. Whilst it is acknowledged that sites such as Enterprise House or Love Lane Industrial Estate may be quoting far lower rents, these are older stock, without the same quality features and would be less cost effective to run without the renewable features

Below is the current status for each unit.

Unit 1 14,000 sq ft - internally leased to Shropshire Museums, for the storage of items from Shirehall, Acton Scott etc etc.

Unit 2 - 15,000 sq ft - In negotiations with a local company which needs more space having secured a new contract.

Unit 3 - 10,000 sq ft - Adventure Cinema are moving into this unit. They have outgrown units 4 A & B

Unit 4A - 2,000 sq ft - Adventure Cinema moving out – in discussions with small 'ketchup' company

Unit 4B - 2,000 sq ft – Adventure Cinema moving out - interest from a sugar free cake manufacturer

Unit 4C - 2,000 sq ft - Occupied - a fine art dealer, slowly moving in.

Unit 4D - 2,000 sq ft - New tenant – VANLIFE - in soon. Vanlife converts vans into campervans.

Unit 4E - 2,000 sq ft - Occupied - MONK FITNESS.

Disability Parking and Road Markings

It was agreed, as reported in this newsletter earlier in the year, that a second disabled parking space was to be introduced outside the Pharmacy/Chemist and one put in on the Auction Yard and on Market Place. It was expected that the necessary 'lines', along with several other road markings, would be put back by Shropshire County Council once the resurfacing had been completed. This has not yet happened and a number of complaints have been received. The Council is on the case and hopefully the situation will be rectified shortly.

Harley Jenkins Street Car Park - Electric Vehicle Charging

The number of electric vehicles on the roads is increasing. Visitors and local residents are often unable to charge their electric vehicles

as all of the charging bays are now occupied – some to appear to be using these bays for long-term parking.

Petrol and diesel vehicles should not occupy these spaces. If yours is one of these vehicles please reposition it to a standard parking bay. Additionally, if you are charging your own electric vehicle, please ensure that you reposition it as soon as possible after your vehicle has charged so that other drivers may use the facility. Thank you.

Green bins

Town Hall Clock

A grant has been obtained from the Lottery Heritage fund to erect scaffolding and repair and renovate the Town Hall Clock. The Town Council has approved the work which will be undertaken as soon as the weather allows.

This includes a video tour of the premises along with comments from residents together with full details of all the information required about the home for any one who may be interested including prospective residents and anyone interested in becoming a volunteer.

Kerosene oil leak

There has been an oil leak at the top of town, mainly affecting residents of Bull Street. The oil is running in a small drain under several houses causing noxious smells and discomfort. The source of the oil, which is likely to be at the top of Town, has still not been identified. Shropshire Council, Severn Trent, the Environment Agency,

insurance companies and other agencies have all been involved. We really need property owners /residents in the area, within and around the area marked red on the attached map, to check oil tank levels daily and to keep a record of these checks. Also, please, please let the Town Council know if you have seen a dramatic drop in your oil levels or find any break in a pipe or unexplained oil in or around your oil tank.

The concern is that the oil will get into the town's water drainage system damaging the wider environment. Wherever you are in Town, if you smell oil, please let the Town Council know immediately.

Security

With the onset of winter, the police have asked all households to be especially vigilant and ensuring that when left all properties are properly locked and secure.

There also some nasty 'scams' circulating including Winter Fuel Payment scams. There are reports of adverts appearing on Facebook and Instagram which may use authentic looking Government department logos and headers. Basically, these scams are promoting a "Winter Fuel Payment" or a "Heating Subsidy" which of course do not exist.

If you are actually eligible, then you will have received a genuine letter from DWP in October.

The things to look out for in these adverts are:

- Poor spelling and grammar
- Low quality images
- 'Too good to be true offers'

Always check the account details behind the advert and never click on any links provided or pass over personal details which they may ask for.

Flooding

The floods in October highlighted some areas in and around Bishop's Castle where properties flooded or could be in danger of flooding. These include some areas at the bottom of town and Colebatch. The Council has decided to improve its stock of sandbags and other preventative measures. If you have reason to believe your property has a high risk of flooding please advise the Council. Flooding is exacerbated by blocked or faulty drains. Please ensure that any malfunctioning drains are reported to 'Fix My Street Shropshire County Council'.

BCTC Biodiversity and Climate Action

I have had several interesting replies to my last article. Thank you.

Please continue with your suggestions. They are all worthy of consideration.

Together our gardens are a vast living landscape. And it's not hard to help the animals that visit or live in our gardens.

Wildlife is all animals and plants that live and grow independently of people usually in natural conditions. Wildlife such as hedgehog, sparrow, song thrush and stag beetle are animals seriously in decline. Caring for our gardens for wildlife can help these animals and others find refuge and food.

One simple task is to leave piles of fallen leaves lying in garden corners and yards and not to cut perennial flowers such as sedum, alliums and phlox stems back until early spring. Seed heads and stems will provide food and shelter throughout the winter.

Fallen leaves provide shelter and food for birds, insects, frogs and toads and micro-organisms in the soil. Remove leaves from lawns, paths and borders however as they can smother plants.

Remember to put out water and fresh food for birds in freezing weather and break the ice on your pond or birdbath.

Bins for Boys - thank you Bishop's Castle.

The Lingen Davies Cancer Fund, a cancer charity, under the 'Bins for Boys' Project is calling for public venues to add sanitary bins to male toilets and raise awareness that a lack of them is letting men down.

Men who need a place to hygienically dispose of their pads, pouches, stomas, catheters, colostomy, or ileostomy bags (small intestine v large intestine stoma bags) following cancer or illness, are lacking places to do so when they are out and about.

The Bins for Boys project, spearheaded by the Lingen Davies Cancer Fund, one of the region's primary cancer charities, was launched in Bishop's Castle on 4th November. So far, 11 venues have signed up:

Castle Hotel, Herbies Café, Bishop's Castle Town Hall, Auction Yard Toilets, The Happy Bap, The Poetry Pharmacy, The Poppy House, Enterprise House, Six Bells Pub, Crown & Anchor Vaults, SpArC Leisure Centre.

Look out for Bins for Boys stickers at venue entrances, toilet doors, cubicles, and on the bins themselves.

Incontinence can be a side effect of cancer and cancer treatment. It

Danny Lloyd - Jones, 36 from Oswestry, is involved in promoting the project. Danny was diagnosed with bowel cancer just before his 32nd birthday and was told on the same day he would need major surgery and to have a stoma.

Tim Cooper, Chair of Trustees for Lingen Davies, said: "We know many men fear being unable to find a toilet with sanitary bins, which makes them anxious, worried, and humiliated. It can stop them leaving their homes to take part in everyday activities like enjoying a pub meal with friends, or a cup of coffee in a local café.

"Lingen Davies is signing up venues and supplying them with Bins for Boys stickers and giving venue name checks on social media channels and adding them to our specially developed Bins for Boys webpage and live interactive google map so that people can see venues taking part and plan their outings accordingly. Any venue which signs up and gets a bin will be added."

St John the Baptist Church - A plea for funds and donations Our beautiful and historic church is in desperately urgent need of extensive repairs to the fabric of the building, in particular the roof.

There is an urgent need to carry out remedial and then more permanent work following a plaster fall which has recently taken place in the south transept. We know that this will be expensive. Without these works we are in danger of having regular plaster falls and cannot continue to risk injury to people, or further deterioration to the fabric of the building.

We want to ensure that our church is there for the Bishop's Castle community for many years to come. We want to continue to be able to come together for regular services, as well as to celebrate joyful occasions such as Christmas, Easter, weddings and baptisms or to be able to gather to support one another for sad occasions such as funerals. As a church we also offer regular companionship to people

can also affect men who have suffered a range of other illnesses including Crohn's disease and irritable bowel syndrome. For example, 1 in 8 men will get prostate cancer, and some experience bladder and bowel problems as a side effect of their treatment. In the UK, about 1 in 3 men over 65 will experience urinary incontinence issues, while 1 in 20 men aged 60 and over will experience bowel incontinence. (Source Cancer Research U.K.). 1 in 25 men over 40 will experience some form of urinary leakage every year

- 1 in 20 men over 60 will experience bowel incontinence in the UK
- This is a hidden problem that's not confined solely to older people.

Lingen Davies, which exists to make a positive impact on lives affected by cancer, took the evidence from a nationwide campaign by various cancer charities, which also lobbied the government about the issue, and wanted to create a real and lasting change locally.

Along with volunteer support it helps raise awareness about the signs and symptoms of cancer, and the long-term impact it can have and with the 'Bins for Boys' project, for men in particular.

Local lead for Lingen Davies, Miranda Ashwell, said the charity wants public venues to commit to providing a sanitary bin in their male toilet.

"Getting a sanitary bin, or an extra one from a supplier is a very low-cost thing to do but it could make a huge difference to men who are out and about and need one. We are rolling this out across Shrop-shire, Telford and Wrekin, and Mid Wales, the region served by Lingen Davies, and we hope to encourage awareness in other areas and even nationally.

"We are really grateful for the response from venues in Bishop's Castle. It sets an amazing benchmark for other places to follow.

"The solution is simple. Community venues can provide sanitary bins in their men's toilets. And through the project men who need sanitary bins need will know where to find them. We hope as many public locations as possible in the region will get behind this and pledge to become a Bins for Boys venue."

The Future of Pugh's Butchers Shop

As readers will be aware, a group of residents came together earlier this year to explore how to respond to Andrew Pugh's plans to retire, and ensure his shop remains a key part of our High Street. We hope that, beyond continuing to support our local economy with affordable, fresh, local produce, the project can also create wider social, economic and environmental benefits for our community.

In order to understand what future approach would be most useful and desirable, we circulated a survey with the August BC Newsletter asking for your views. Thanks to the 180 people who took the time to complete it – that's a fantastic response rate - over 10% of the town's population! The results, which were presented at a well-attended public meeting in late September, showed an overwhelming majority of respondents felt it was important that the shop: stays open

continues functioning as a butchers to provide locally sourced meat and poultry

champions other local food producers across a range of goods, including fruit and veg, bread and cheese.

At the meeting, we discussed the next steps needed to turn intention into reality and discussed possible sources of advice and practical help. We're very grateful that Light Foot have offered to act as an 'umbrella' while we're setting up – there's obviously a great fit between the Pugh's project and Light Foot's established 'Food Forward' objectives of supporting local food producers, meeting community needs and increasing food resilience. Looking beyond BC, we're also talking with the Plunkett Foundation (www.plunkett.co.uk), the UK's leading provider of advice, business support and training to establish successful community businesses that make a positive impact for local people. Finally, we want to say a big thank you to the Pugh family for working with us and answering a lot of questions(!) to help us understand how we can take this project forward.

Museum acquires a rare piece of Bishop's Castle history

The charity that runs the House on Crutches Museum and the Heritage Resource Centre is always on the lookout for artefacts related to the history of Bishop's Castle. This very rare mug came up for auction in October and thanks to a large number of people making donations a successful bid was made.

The mug was created to celebrate two men who stood against Lord Clive's chosen candidates in the 1818 parliamentary election. Bish-

op's Castle was a "rotten borough" with two parliamentary seats and Clive controlled the elections by bribing the few BC citizens who were entitled to vote, thus making sure his nen got in. Not surprisingly Kinnaird and Elect were not elected but someone thought it worthwhile to praise their effort.

The museum is currently closed but preparations have started for the re-opening in in April 2025 and the mug will be on display alongside all the other artefacts that tell the history and stories of Bishop's Castle. We are recruiting people to act as museum stewards next season and if you are interested get in touch with our steward coordinator Jane Allard (janemallard29@gmail.com).

In November, the Bishop's Castle Heritage Resource Centre celebrated the 20th anniversary of its founding. The 200-year-old building started life as a non-conformist chapel but more recently housed the library until that was moved to Enterprise House. A grant was then obtained to buy the building, restore it and create a heritage resource centre. Initially it was a storage location for House on Crutches Museum artefacts that were not on display in the museum. Over the years it has developed into a centre for researching and publicising the history of Bishop's Castle and has become a treasure trove of reference books, maps, census returns, trade directories and many other resources. Public displays about local history are regularly created and volunteers help visitors who have roots in the area to research their family history as well as assisting local people to investigate the history of their houses. BCHRC is open to the public most Saturday mornings all year round and well worth a visit.

New Community Orchard and Apple Pressing

The orchard trees funded by the National Community Lottery were planted in March and have grown well, although they won't fruit for a couple of years! A fruit press and pasteurising kit were also provided by the National Community Lottery fund and despite no fruit this year it has been put to good use. On 6th October allotment holders experimented with the new equipment, bringing their own apples to make delicious apple juice which was enjoyed straight away, although it could have been pasteurised, which would have kept it for two years! The apple pressing occasion was great fun and will be repeated next year. The apple pressing kit is available for people in Bishop's Castle to hire. There is a deposit and a hiring charge for the equipment which comprises a scratter/crusher, fruit press and pasteurising machine

On 7th November, Tom the Apple Man from Oswestry, who appeared on Gardeners World recently, held a fruit tree pruning course at the new orchard. Ten allotment holders learnt from Tom how to prune their fruit trees. This event was also funded by the National Community Lottery Fund.






