### Councillor profiles



Cllr. Lucy Blundell joined Bishop's Castle Council in 2024. She lives in Oak Meadow with her husband and two children who both attend Bishop's Castle Primary School. She has lived in the Bishop's Castle area all her life and works as a teaching assistant in a local primary school. Lucy's key Council responsibility is in ensuring the provision of services to young people in the area to make sure they have safe areas to go to.



Clir. Jane Carroll: was elected to the Town Council a few years after moving to the Town 40 years ago. She has served as Mayor and her key Council responsibilities include the allotments, footpaths, tourism and Town Centre matters. She is a director of Enterprise South West Shropshire (Enterprise House).



Cllr. Josh Dickin: Josh lives in Ox Leasow with his partner Shane and cat Ginny. He has served as Mayor for nearly three years and two years prior as Deputy Mayor during Covid. He has many fingers in a lot of pies and all for the good of The Castle. It has not been easy being the youngest Mayor in Bishop's Castle's history and he has learnt a lot since rejoining the council in late 2018. He was also the youngest elected Councillor in 2015 at age 18. Josh believes that Bishop's Castle and Shropshire as whole, are great places to work and live. He works tirelessly to get a fair deal for rural Shropshire.



Cllr. Brigit Drake: Brigit has lived in Bishop's Castle for 10 years and brought her four children up here. She has been a member of the Town Council for nearly a year and has enjoyed her time so far and met some interesting folk. She is also secretary of the Love Lane, formerly Bishop's Castle, Allotment Society having been a plot holder for several years.



Cllr. Tim Halford: joined BC Council in 2020. He lives in Welsh Street. Key Council responsibilities - Allotments Committee, Old Market Square Group, Newsletter. He is also a member of the Parochial Church Council and Chair of the Newtown based Milford Collection and a director of Mid-Wales Food and Land Trust. Clir Ruth Houghton is a Bishop's Castle Town Councillor and also the Liberal Democrat Shropshire Councillor for the Bishop's Castle Division. ### **Updates and Bits and Pieces**

Recycling Centres Far fewer people are now using the recycling centres which may be a result of the new booking scheme. This may call the continued viability of Craven Arms to into question. There is a move to try to get the booking scheme lifted – which could also save staffing time and costs. **New Co-op** Tenders are being sent out for the building of the new Co-op.

<u>Public Hall</u> The Public Hall is not fit for purpose and cannot be brought up to the required standards. Discussions are underway with regard to its sale. As it is a charity, the proceeds of any sale have to meet the requirements of the charity in providing or supporting the provision of meeting space in Bishop's Castle.

<u>Disabled Spaces/Parking/Road Markings</u> The Council is pressing Shropshire Council to get the agreed road markings and disabled spaces implemented as soon as possible. It is rated as a high priority by Shropshire Council

<u>Piano</u> A Bechstein grand piano of concert quality has been kindly loaned to St John's Church by Hugh and Liza Petter who live in Union Street. Hugh, a pianist of great renown, will be giving classical concerts in the church.

<u>Church Clock Face Renovation</u> The Diocese has given approval and the church architect and restorer advised. It is planned in the first week of May to have the clock face removed; it will be away for about 4 weeks. It is hoped the restored clock face should be in place for the Summer events in the Town. Scaffolding will need to be erected and if anybody is willing to supply this the PCC would be very grateful.

<u>War Memorial</u> Approval to proceed is still awaited from the Church in Hereford. This issue is being pursued rigorously. It is hoped that the matter will be resolved by the Spring of 2025.

**Town Hall Clock** Renovations should be completed in the Spring.

<u>Church Opening Times</u> the Church will be open on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays during February, and possibly March, except for scheduled events i.e. coffee mornings and services. On other days the Church will be open from 10am until 3 pm. It is anticipated that the Church will be open every day from Holy Week stating with Palm Sunday -13<sup>th</sup> April.

<u>Hospital</u> All 16 beds are occupied and there is a healthy buzz about the place. The "Save our Beds" group has become the "Support our beds" group (still **SoBs!**). The trust is now looking to expand outpatient services, and we are trying to progress becoming volunteers in the hospital. *Andy Stelman on behalf of the SoBs group*.

<u>People and Places</u> - Following the proposed sale of the Public Hall and the need for major work at St John's Church, the largest indoor space in the town, a consultation has been carried out into the future need for indoor public space in Bishop's Castle. First a huge thank you is necessary to everyone who took part. A large number of responses has been received The consultation also included a survey of current venues in the Town and their capacity and facilities.

On Wednesday Feb 19<sup>th</sup> at 11am and on Wednesday Feb 26 <sup>th</sup> at 6.30pm - there will be an exhibition at St John's Church of the findings of the consultation. As, based on the consultation, a project will be developed to progress the findings, it is hoped that as many people as possible will visit St John's on the above dates to give their views.

All are welcome to the Church on these dates. This is a chance to have your say about the proposals for the Church & Public Hall.

<u>Oil Leak –</u> the issue has been now resolved. Many thanks to all those who checked their systems and provided help to those affected by the leak.

#### **NEWS FROM THE STARS**

Just a couple of days before Christmas, the Bishop's Castle Community Land Trust name went up on the Stars shop front, a fitting and final touch to its renovation and marking the end of a momentous year for the Trust. Lively interest is already being shown by those wishing to use this community space f or exhibitions, meetings, local artists and craftspeople, as well as for fundraising. There will be much more of the same in 2025.

The Trust's board members, Kate Evans, Jim Gaffney, Julie Magill, Stuart Taylor, Josh Dickin, Andy Stelman, Ruth Houghton, Caroline Denham, Stuart Phillips, Cheryl McCullogh, Tony Graham and Jonathan Brown sincerely thank you, the people of Bishop's Castle who have believed in, and supported, the Save the Stars project. There are too many to thank individually, but the Trust would like to pay tribute to members of the Clun Valley Quakers for their generous support.

The Trust's 2025 AGM will be held in March, and before then a drive will be launched to attract new volunteers, to help to run events and to support ongoing efforts to serve the community.

Here is a message form one of our key supporters 'What an achievement by all of the team! All the hard work, setbacks and I am sure headaches along the way have been so worthwhile for the tenants and the community as a whole. What a joy it is to walk out of co-op and not be faced with the eyesore that was the old shop'.

The former Stars newsagent closed its doors in 2015, and the building stood empty and neglected until it was bought by the Trust in 2021, thanks to a generous bequest from local hero Bill Bainbridge, previous partowner of the Three Tuns.

Here he is raising a glass with Gwen Roberts, whose family ran the pub for over 120 years.

After three years of work, the building has been completely renovated and extended, to provide two flats for local people in housing need. Tenants moved in this August, almost exactly nine years to the day since the Stars ceased trading. The ground floor flat is occupied by a young man who works in a local factory, and the first floor flat is now home for a couple with a young child, who both work in one of the Town's care homes.

The shop is in a conservation area, and the 1980's frontage was replaced with one more in keeping with the street's streetscape, completed with a



pair of cast-iron columns found in a salvage yard, then shot blasted and powder coated. There is a strong tradition in the Town for buildings to be embellished in bold designs; so there was only one way to go when it came to decorating the Stars!

This Autumn, the Trust was delighted to be singled out by the Bishops Castle Civic Society, which awarded it the Jack and Gillian Mawdsley Cup for the year's best new work or renovation project. The Trust was also nominated for an award at the National Community Land Trust Network's AGM.

Since September, the shop has been busy on several occasions, hosting a wide variety of people and community organisations, including; two artists, an animal welfare charity shop (twice), a pop-up book shop, and a coffee morning. In early 2025 it will be providing one of the venues for the Bishop's Castle Arts Festival, and be a show-case for local craftsmen, a black-smith and a carpenter.

Funding has come from many sources, including a mortgage from the Ecology Building Society, a grant from Shropshire Council, and donations from many other individuals and groups, some local firms and charitable trusts. The Trust is also very grateful to all the people who have freely given of their time, materials and skills to help this community-led project moving forward.

The Save the Stars project has cost the Trust in excess of £230,000, and it is still seeking some funds to meet all of its financial obligations. So far, 85 people have supported the Stars Appeal, raising £10,205 towards the target of £21,000.





### <u>Town Museum to Re-open</u> <u>with Exciting New Exhibits</u>


The House on Crutches Museum opens for 2025 on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> of April with some exciting new items on display.

The Museum tells the story of Bishop's Castle with a selection of displays illustrating the life of the Town over several centuries.

New this year is a commemorative mug dating from 1818 celebrating the election that year of The Hon. Douglas Kinnaird and Sir William Eleott Bart.

At this time, Bishop's Castle was one of the notorious "rotten boroughs" returning two MPs to parliament. There was much bribery and cajolery at these elections; The Clive family controlled the town and the mug commemorates the attempt to remove their representatives. The inscription reads 'The Hon'ble Douglas Kinnaird, and Sir Willian Eleott Bt Champions of People rights who boldly sought to defend them against the Overgrown corrupt influence of a Boroughmongering Peer. Bishop's Castle, in the County of Salop. 18th June 1818.

The mug was bought at auction in October. This was made possible by a number of generous donations.



### Town Museum to Re-open with Exciting New Exhibits

Also on display, for the first time, will be a gold sovereign from "The Bishop's Castle Hoard". A large number of sovereigns were found in a piano donated to Bishop's Castle Community College in 2019. The museum was able secure one of these, dating from 1869.



The museum will be open from 1.30 to 4.30 every Saturday and Sunday from April12th to the end of September and on Good Friday and Bank Holiday Mondays.

The museum is run entirely by volunteers and new stewards are always welcome.

### **Onny Valley Sewage Crisis**

There is a proposal from Severn Trent, Shropshire Council, the Environment Agency and Natural England to build a pipeline from the Bishop's Castle sewage treatment works to enable the discharge of excess sewage into the pristine River Onny. Currently excess sewage is pumped into the River Kemp, the stream that runs though the Council allotments near the Business Park and into the River Clun, which also not acceptable. This does not only affect the immediate area, but Craven Arms and Ludlow too.

All new housing developments in the Clun River catchment area, which includes Bishop's Castle, have been put on hold because of high nutrient pollution in our rivers. The Onny pipeline scheme is designed to alleviate this situation so that new housing can be developed. New housing, especially affordable housing is needed, but there are other ways of treating the sewage, such as an upgrade to the current treatment facilities, which should be considered.

An extensive campaign is being mounted. Local groups, such as Fish Legal, acting on behalf of Plowden Fishing Club, have objected and letters have been written to the Chief Executives of the above organisations and the Member of Parliament for South Shropshire.

If you support the campaign, there is a petition through Change.org calling for the pipe to be stopped and to register your protest. Please get as many of your family and friends to sign it too.

# Patients Group News Winter 2025 Bishop's Castle Surgery

### Personnel changes

New members of the team have been settling in to the Practice during the Autumn. The important role of phlebotomist for our local community has been taken up by our new health care assistant, Sophia Wright. We also have a new paramedic practitioner, Natalie Rawlings, and a new GP, Dr. Eleanor Hartley. In reception we also welcome Nicola Jones. Dr. David Mitchell has now also started to see patients and he will become a partner in the Practice in the new year when we say goodbye and thank you to Dr. Tom Davies. The Practice has been extremely fortunate to attract new staff at a time when health services are under so much pressure.

There has been some concern expressed to us about the new partnership arrangements with Drs. Morton and Mitchell being partners at both Bishop's Castle and Station Drive in Ludlow. Some people have seen this as a 'merger'. The two surgeries remain independent but experience and good practice can and are being shared to the benefit of both sets of patients. A concrete example of this occurred recently when, in the heavy snow, power was lost at the BC surgery. The BC team were able to contact Station Drive Practice and arrange for urgent prescriptions to be put through to the Pharmacy without inconveniencing or worrying patients.

### Vaccination update

The Covid and flu vaccinations during the Autumn have gone well. Covid vaccination is now ending but flu vaccinations are still available for those who are eligible. There has already been a significant rise in people being admitted to hospital with flu complications, so vaccination is particularly important this winter season.

### **Lasting Power of Attorney**

If you have set up a friend or relative with Power of Attorney on your behalf it is a good idea to inform the Practice. A copy of your Lasting Power of Attorney documents can be kept with your patient notes and allows doctors to know who to talk to about a patient's treatment if necessary.
