Sunshine Coast FC International Academy Bishop's Castle Update A message from Managing Director, Noel Woodall

As we move closer to welcoming our young players from Australia, who are scheduled to fly out of Australia on 28 July for the launch of our full-time International Academy based at the Grange, we wanted to provide a brief update on recent activity and developments.

In my absence, our Sporting Director, Melvyn Wilkes, led an open evening at the Grange where he provided a comprehensive overview of our progress. The event brought together a number of invited guests for an enjoyable evening of refreshments and conversation. For many, it was also a chance to reconnect with former Grange colleagues and friends, reinforcing our commitment to meaningful community integration and collaboration.

We were also pleased to roll out a short 15-day tour that saw 20 of our Under 9 - Under 13 players and their families visit Bishop's Castle over the Easter period in April.

The tour was a huge success with our teams travelling to Professional clubs as well as working alongside the English FA and English Premier League at the National Football Centre at St George's Park in Burton On Trent.

We also included a friendly match against the local Bishop's Castle U12s team, followed by a small BBQ and social gathering at the Grange.

We are truly grateful for the warm welcome our young players and their families received, and we trust that the local people who met them found them respectful, friendly, and professional. We also hear that the local pubs received some healthy support during the visit from our travelling parents and families!

These early engagements mark the beginning of a long-term commitment to creating a positive impact in the area—both socially and economically. The continued development of the Grange represents an opportunity not only for the players and staff involved but also for local businesses and employment.

We have already appointed five UK-based staff members, with further additions to our technical coaching team expected soon. Our aim is to establish a robust and sustainable presence, contributing to job creation and growth in the local area.

Our education partnership with the Community College Bishop's Castle is also progressing well. As part of our commitment to the programme, we have invested in the purchase of new goals, installed perimeter fencing around the school playing fields, secured a new zero-turn mower, and added a storage container. We are currently in discussions with a turf specialist to further improve the condition of the school's football pitch.

Meanwhile, work continues at the Grange and the neighbouring Vine properties. We are now moving into Phase 2 of renovations, with up to three more phases under review as we aim to further enhance the facilities.

Fellow Director Joshua Woodall, Melvyn and I will return to Bishop's Castle in early June. This visit will allow us to continue discussions on potential new developments—some of which could lead to additional local employment opportunities further down the track.

We look forward to seeing many familiar faces when we return, and thank the Bishop's Castle community once again for your support and enthusiasm as this exciting journey unfolds.

Updates and bits and pieces

<u>Public Hall</u> - A sale of the Public Hall has now been agreed and arrangements are being finalised. The funds when received, will be protected for the purposes outlined in the deeds and trust documents. The Town Council, acting as Custodian Trustees will decide how, if and when these funds will be used and for what purpose subject to the approval of the Charities' Commission.

<u>The Marches Choir</u> will be singing Karl Jenkins "The Armed Man" on 28th June 2025 in the St. John's Church in Bishop's Castle.

<u>Disabled Spaces/Parking/Road Markings</u> – Please can everyone keep the disabled parking places outside the Pharmacy and the Church free for blue badge holders? There have been several complaints that the spaces have been blocked by cars not displaying a blue badge sign or sticker. Shropshire Council Highways Department are moving forward with the lining issues and marking the disabled parking spaces properly. It may still be a couple of months away before the necessary action is taken.

'Co-op' – The contract for building and fitting out the new Co-op in Station Street is now out for tender and it is expected that work will start in September. It will take around three months before the new shop is ready to open.

<u>Church Clock Dial Renovation</u> - The approximately six-foot diameter clock dial - renowned for its single 'hand' - on the North-facing side of the Church tower is to be refurbished, cleaned and repainted. This will require removal of the face on 24th June followed by off-site work for about four weeks during its restoration. A grant has been offered by Shropshire Historic Churches Trust and an application for a grant towards this work has been made to the Town Council.

<u>Three Tuns</u> - Heineken have confirmed that they have put forward a new scheme for the Three Tuns for approval by the Star Pubs Board. Along with other improvements, this plan will include the installation of a fire escape so that the pub can be advertised 'with landlord accommodation'. It is hoped that this will help to attract the right tenant. The scheme is still being worked on by their property team. They will advise us once the scheme has been approved by the board. Heineken have said "The situation will improve with a new tenant".

This supports the view of CAMRA which has said that 'they don't think permanent closure is likely as the Three Tuns is listed and is not suitable for conversion'. In view of recent shortages of real ale at the Three Tuns, the local Camra branch is also considering pulling the pub from its Good Beer Guide.

<u>Church Opening Times</u> – St.John the Baptist Church is open daily for visitors, quiet reflection and prayer. There are Bibles in the prayer chapel, a peaceful space, for visitors to read. The church is open daily

between 10am and 3pm - although sometimes earlier and later (depending upon who is opening and closing). We look forward to welcoming you. Kathy Taylor, Churchwarden.

<u>Church Organ</u> – Following water damage from a leak in the roof, many elements of the Church organ have been taken away for stripping down and renovation. It will take a couple of months, while a complete renovation of the air supply system, including bellows and wind chamber, is undertaken before the organ can be reinstated. At the moment, some parts of the organ are located in the south transept. Visitors are asked to be careful. The restoration of the organ should improve sound quality and should enable the organ to be used for many years to come.

Much of the cost was covered by insurance but as the wear on the bellows was only found when the pipes were removed there is a shortfall in funding. Any donations will, therefore, be greatly appreciated. These can be made by card (in the vestibule), or cash/cheque which can be placed in the black donations box on the right as you enter church. If you would like to make a regular donation, our Treasurer, Roger Taylor, 01588638355 would be pleased to hear from you.

People and Public Spaces Project, Bishop's Castle - The report on the results of the Community Consultation exercise based on public spaces in the town and their use has now been produced and circulated. It will form the basis for a project, following the sale of the Public Hall, to see how the facilities in the town can best be improved to meet the need for community events and occasions going forward. Thanks go to everyone who has participated. This work was jointly funded by The Town Council and St. John's Church.

<u>War Memorial</u> - There is movement on the renovation of the War Memorial. A 'notice' has been placed in the Times and local press to try to resolve the issue. The **War Memorial**, which stands by the North entrance to the Church is to be cleaned and the names of those who lost their lives made 'readable'. If no claim of interest or ownership is made then the Chancellor of the Church of England will

consider the case and make a judgement, following which it is hoped that permission will be given to proceed with the work.

<u>Church Window -</u> The damaged stained glass window in the South aisle of St. John's Church, directly opposite the main entrance, is to be repaired. With advice from specialists, a quote from a stained glass artist has been accepted. A dates for the work to be undertaken has not yet been finalised. The work is funded by an insurance claim.

The Bishop's Castle Youth Hub, which takes place in St John's Church after school every Friday during term-time, regularly sees 24 young people aged 11 to 15 join for pizza, biscuits, drinks, craft activities, outdoor play, board games and with a Christian input each week at the end. In addition, two drop-in sessions, were also recently held in church to meet local families.

Community Heat Network Planning Application update

In the last issue of the newsletter, it was confirmed that after three years' effort, a planning application had been submitted for a 1MW wind turbine just outside Bishop's Castle.

As a final detail to the planning application for the wind turbine, Shrop-shire Council's Senior Planning Officer asked for an update to the project's Heritage Report to take into account the Colebatch Motte (this is a medieval castle mound, now mostly under trees, about 1km away from the turbine site). This Heritage Report update has been completed and the report submitted. The outcome of the wind turbine planning application is now awaited.

The tone of the communications from the Planning Officer has been positive so far, and we are hopeful of a favourable outcome. Indeed, by the time you are reading this newsletter we may already have learnt the outcome. If so, we'll do our best to spread the news as quickly as possible, including posting it on Lightfoot's website. https://lightfootenterprises.org/heat-network/ This website also provides further details about how the project will both benefit the town and people of Bishop's Castle and greatly reduce our carbon foot print enabling us to help in the fight to reduce global warming.

BC Waste Water Treatment Works & River Onny Pipeline update

Severn Trent has withdrawn its proposal to build the (£8 million) Onny pipeline and is working on 'alternative solutions'. While this move is welcome, there are no details yet about whether the funds will be used elsewhere to correct the issue and whether any proposal from Severn Trent will address the water treatment problem which is currently blocking the development of 100 much needed homes in Bishop's Castle.

It was confirmed by Severn Trent at the public meeting in March 2025 that the treatment works has capacity to handle the proposed housing developments. It is therefore presumed that, if the water treatment process was more efficient and the quality of the waste water improved, it would allow the much-needed additional housing to be pursued. It has been queried

A. why work has not been done to find additional land for reed beds, or other natural water cleaning processes, of which there are several examples, which would mitigate the problem.

B. in a world of constantly advancing technology, cannot an additional process, i.e. digesters/chemical treatment/nitrate and phosphate capture, be found to lower the levels of nutrients to well below permit levels before the treated water is released from the sewage works, thus negating the need for the pipeline?

C. the two housing developments cannot incorporate primary sewage treatment systems, as happens elsewhere to reduce nitrate and phosphate levels before waste goes to the sewage plant. Even if treated effluent does then have to pass through the sewage works, the impact on the environment could be minimised at this stage.

A letter has been drafted to be sent to The Rt. Hon. A Rayner MP., Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government when further information is available from Severn Trent on their new plans now that the Onny pipeline proposal has been withdrawn. A number of ideas are being put forward for her consideration where it is believed her help, advice and action could be beneficial.

<u>Bishop's Castle Midsummer 24 Hour Tennis Challenge</u> <u>21st - 22nd June</u>

Going Wild in Bishop's Castle

Going Wild has been busy as usual this Spring. Bishop's Castle Moth Group has been meeting up each month, adding more species to our town records. Meetings are starting to get crowded, both in terms of moths and people! Our next dates will be: Monday 2nd June, Monday 23rd June, Monday 21st July! Keep an eye on the socials for more updates.

In other news, we held our first scything training session, open to all. This training will aid more of our volunteers to continue managing the many burgeoning meadows around Bishops Castle and is just one part of a much wider series of free training sessions which will soon be made available, to include safeguarding, coppicing, hedge-laying and several plant husbandry training opportunities.

Our Kids Club continues to let young people in BC loose in nature... recent adventures have included wandering through a bluebell wood, Easter egg hunts and tree-planting, as well as the usual sample of mad outdoor games.

Our conservation volunteers have been busy making dead-hedges. raking our cut meadows, planting meadow-plug plants to increase food for our pollinating insects and scything new sites ready for this year's 'no mow' season. You can find the latest work-parties listed on our white-board on the Co-op board, or on Dan's office door at Enterprise House! Look out for our new 'No-mow' signs dotted about the Town, these are to help make sure our wildlife sites remain unscathed during this short three month meadow season.

Our newly minted Wildlife Gardening Group has had its first session, transforming a garden on Oak Meadow for nature and veg-growing. On Friday 16th May we offered help with wildlife gardening, including handing out pollinator friendly seeds and starter plants, as well as running a work party session between 10 and 12, when we worked on the host's garden. We'll eventually be touring the whole town...if you'd like your street to be next, let us know!

Lastly, our swifts are back! Keep your eyes peeled for the next Swift Group meeting, where we'll outline what we'll be doing as we survey swifts this season

The bad news first: Installation of the pool is due to start on January 5 2026 and take a maximum of 16 weeks.

Part of the reason for the delay is that £2.7 million has been granted to SpArC under the Government's decarbonisation fund. This is to be spent in stages over 2.5 years, on a project to reduce running costs through replacing the boilers with air source heating, installing solar water heating and insulating the pool building.

The installation of the pool is now the first stage in a much bigger project, being planned in parallel with the Pool project, which is making the pool planning a bit more complex. The implementation team is virtually the same as the Whitchurch Swimming and Fitness Centre team, made possible because the pool project is now the first stage in a much bigger one.

Our case was hugely strengthened by the fact that this community had already invested £250,000 into the pool project.
