Hello, and welcome to this end of year edition of the Newsletter.

It has not been the easiest of years for many towns, especially those that rely on visitors to keep their economies healthy. Bishop's Castle is one of those and we too have seen a reduction in footfall.

In true Bishop's Castle spirit however the town has not grown despondent but demonstrated its resilience. In 2025 we have put on some of the most successful events ever. The Arts Festival, Walking Festival, Carnival,

Party in the Park, Michaelmas Fair and many others have all been amazing this year, a tribute to all those who gave their time and expertise or have been of support in other ways. These events are a key part of what makes this town special.

The wonderful Pearl of Africa Children's Choir concert on 23rd October – see cover - is one example of many individual performances that show that the Town is alive and well and embracing the future with enthusiasm.

There have been many other achievements too. All our hostelries have responded to the difficult environment with the Three Tuns and King's Head delighting under new management and The Castle Hotel, Six Bells and Vaults continuing to evolve and to contribute enormously to the Town. We must also not forget the cafes, restaurants and coffee shops who, along with our excellent shops and providers of accommodation, give our visitors a warm welcome, The Happy Bap, The Poppy House, The Chai Shop, The Poetry Pharmacy, Yarborough House, Herbies, the Dragons Lair, Bishop's Castle Delight and The Ganges all deserve a big thank you.

In 2026 there will be a focus on tidying up the town. The Three Tuns will have a facelift, the Co-op will move, the Old Bowling Green will take on a new life and those buildings in the Town that currently let it down will gently be encouraged to smarten up.

This process started in 2025 and it must not be forgotten that at St John's Church in 2025 nearly £150,000 has been raised and spent on the new clock face, rebuilding of the organ , a replacement window, and some structural repairs – not forgetting the War Memorial. This is a remarkable achievement in these straightened times. The Church can now focus on the major long term fund raising project to carry out the much needed works on the roof and fabric to assure its future.

I would like to welcome Councillor Rachel Bromley back on to the Town Council and to take this opportunity of thanking all the members of the Council, all volunteers receiving no remuneration, for their time and commitment over the year.

It is not yet known if the financial difficulties of Shropshire Council will affect the Town. Whatever happens we will continue to work to support the interests of everyone who lives in the community as best we can.

For the past three years Christine Perkins, a trained youth worker, has worked in a most effective manner developing our youth services, building numbers up and providing a variety of enjoyable and educational activities. She has decided to retire in December 2025 and on behalf of all the Town I wish to say thank you. As a town we must not let all her

good work go to waste.

The Town came together for our Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service held at St John the Baptist Church on the 9th November 2025. Thanks go to Reverend Stephanie Fountain for a thoughtful ceremony, and to the poem readers during the service. Also, thank you to everyone who came out to support the service and join the parade, led by our town band. It was wonderful to see so many wreaths laid, especially from the Sunshine Coast Football Academy and the Quakers.



The 'Bonfire & Fireworks' night on 8th November was once again a great success. I do hope that bonfire night continues to be a mainstay in the town's event calendar. Once again, without volunteers, this event wouldn't have taken place, so thank you!

We will be celebrating the switching on of our 'Christmas Lights' on Saturday 6th December. Please come out to support this event and celebrate. And once again, a big thank you to those volunteers who have helped to put them up or to plug them in for us all to enjoy.

Christmas Lights

The Christmas lights 'switch on' will take place on Saturday 6th December at 6.00pm at The Town Hall There will be a lantern procession starting at the church at 5.50pm following illuminated tractors to the Town Hall. Following the 'switch on', there will be carols around the tree with Bishops Castle Primary School Choir.

Craft Fair

There are already over twenty stallholders, including a tombola, for the craft fair in St John's Church on Saturday 6 December between 11 and 4, Many stall holders from last year are returning with some new participants, including the Youth Hub. Do visit.

News from the Police

Officer uplift since 2024 includes:

- a 1x additional sergeant for South Shropshire which takes Ludlow patch from Sgt Price (meaning better dedication to BC)
- b 1x additional constable to BC team now PC Daryl McWatt and PC Simon Wilkey
- c 2x additional constables to the Ludlow team meaning less abstraction of the BC constables to the demand in Ludlow
- d No change to PCSO numbers (BC still has the fantastic PCSO Shaun Culliss and PCSO Calvin Brown) although they finish work at 20:00 now not 22:00.
- Op Conyay Drug seizures in area since June 25 are sitting at £1.34 million, mixture of Class A and B.
- Anti -Social Behaviour working with school. Plenty of foot patrols to engage and deter
- Op Limit Drink driving ops being completed and intensified over the coming weeks and into the new year – plea for information on those drink driving
- Apart from Clun, BC town has the lowest number of incidents in South Shropshire reported in the last quarter
- CCTV support and happy to get involved in BC Council moves to install. ANPR preferred and open to discuss funding opportunities from the PCC.

- Important to define *neighbourhood* police presence between 8am and midnight as response teams from Shrewsbury and Ludlow still provide cover 24/7. Criminals (or law-abiding members of the public) must not think it is a police free zone in the early hours.

The West Mercia Police website also has information on local surgeries for public to attend and ask questions.

Dangerous Dogs - Police guidance

Reports of dogs being dangerously out of control in a public place have risen over recent years. It is an offence to let a dog be dangerously out of control whether that's in public or private, for example a neighbour's house or garden.

A dog is considered to be dangerously out of control if it injures someone or makes someone worried that the dog might injure them.

A court could also decide that a dog is dangerously out of control if it attacks someone's animal or the owner of an animal thinks they could be injured if they tried to stop your dog attacking

If you own a dog, you are responsible for how it behaves at home and in public and should take steps to make sure that interactions with other dogs and people are safe.

Although the House on Crutches is now closed, we cannot wait until Easter to show you the improvements to the building, so our first openings next year will be in February, during the Bishop's Castle Arts Festival, and we already have a few different things planned.



Not to be missed is the special event being held on the morning of Saturday 21st February. Local folklorist and story-teller, Val Littlehales, will be welcoming groups of up to 10 visitors at a time to give them a tour of the museum, telling Shropshire stories and anecdotes along the way.

Abandoned Vehicles

As a result these car parks are classed as Highway and means that vehicles left in these car parks, even if designated as SORN (Statutory Off Road Notification), are illegally parked. These may be removed by Shropshire Council with costs for removal being charged to the registered owner. If any of these vehicles are yours please ensure that they are removed. This helps to ensure much needed off road parking for people coming to Bishop's Castle for shopping, business or as a visitor.

Bishop's Castle Playing Fields Consultation 2025

Alan Walklett and Pete Carty from Friends of Bishop's Castle Playing Fields (FoBCPF) and Going Wild in Bishop's Castle (GWiBC) attended the October council meeting to present a submission on the Playing Fields proposals. The two groups have worked together on the submission.

This is the end of the first stage. Since the Consultation, which started at the Carnival in July. we have had 48 adult responses and 40 from under 18s. Harriet Carty and GWiBC have produced the Ecological plans with a timetable for work by GWiBC volunteers. It involves ongoing management of the hazel coppice and planting and sowing of native bulbs and wildflowers.

FoBCPF and GWiBC have produced the structural plans which identified a list of remedial work (play area fence, paths, services, benches etc) and improvements. Some of the items on the list need urgent consideration. The list has been influenced by the comments from residents that we received during the summer consultation. There was also discussion on the future shared use of the Old Bowling Green by the Town Council, Going Wild and the community.

The Town Council has considered and approved the submission and will meet with the FoBCPF to discuss a way forward. At the meeting they will decide which of the proposals will proceed to grant application stage, the Town Council having pledged to give any support it can.

Work is starting soon on the removal of the fence and of the band stand, both of which are unsafe.

If the Old Bowling Green could be developed for shared Council and community use it would be a very important part of the development of the Playing Fields. Council Allotment plots available to rent from 1st Jan 2026!

Currently, we have quarter, half and full plots available from January 2026. Other plots may become available as well. Taking on a plot at the start of the year is a great time to begin, as you will have plenty of time to prepare for the next growing season – digging over and preparing the plot, sowing seeds, planting out young plants, watching them grow and looking forward to your harvest of home grown goodness!

Imagine growing your own vegetables ... there are many benefits to being outside with nature, working on the land, and sharing experiences with a community of gardeners!

The Council allotments are gardened organically. Tenants can join the Allotment Society and for a modest membership fee can get manure and other products the Society buys in.

Annual rents for Micro plots are less than £15, plus a deposit/admin fee. Half plots are currently £34, and full sized plots (approximately 165 square metres) are around £58.

Applicants from within the parish of Bishop's Castle are given priority. Why not get in touch to express an interest and discuss what type of plot would suit you? Getting your name on the Waiting List is a good idea, as then you will get first refusal on any plot that comes up.

Services to Young People

Three and a half years ago Bishop's Castle Town Council received the first of two, two year grants totalling £14,000 to kick start a renewed youth focus for young people in the town and beyond. Both grants were seen as "seed money" and cannot be repeated.

For the duration of the projects, we have had the services of a trained youth worker in Christine Perkins. She has worked in a most effective manner, building numbers up in both age groups - 14 for the drop in and 30 for the after school club with a variety of activities arranged both here in BC and elsewhere. and I pay public tribute here to her diligence, resilience and imaginative approach. Chris has decided to retire in December 2025, at the same time as the project money runs out. It is therefore an opportunity to consider the future.

The first option to say the youth project has had a good run but we now have other projects to support would be tantamount to us all turning our backs on our young people.

The second option is to decide that a project needs to continue and apply for further grants to corporate bodies. This would require a great deal of time and energy.

The third option is to take all financial and developmental responsibility for a sustainable youth project completely in-house and taking on another employee specifically to work with young people. It would demonstrate a continuing belief in the importance of working with young people, valuing and them as well as creating opportunities to hear their voices

Recent research, via the High Sheriff's office has revealed that 1 in 4 young people have mental health issues and the NHS waiting time is 362 days and exploitation referrals went up 45% last year with 400 children reported as being sexually abused in Shropshire and needing counselling support.

In addition, ten per cent of young people face addiction. 30% of households in Shrewsbury are food impoverished - hungry children struggle to learn. Truancy is rising at an alarming rate. Thefts in Shropshire by children aged 10 - 17 years rose by 150% in one year. Ten per cent of 16-24 year olds used drugs last year.

This is a worrying picture. The Council will now be considering budgets for next year. Times are tough financially and if the Council is not able to fully support 'option three' I urge them to ensure that Youth Services remains high on the agenda and proper consideration is given as to how our wonderful young people can continue to be supported.



Healthy Life Programme at SpArC

SpArC at Bishop's Castle has recently launched the **Healthy Life Programme** which replaces GP referrals with a broader offer: **Who is it for?**

- Anyone with a condition, including diabetes type 2, which needs an element of support to get them back into the fitness that comes through exercise
- Those on the verge of a medical condition/needing a lifestyle change
- People with chronic knee/hip/back pain, needing a specific, gentle form of exercise
- Those with musculoskeletal problems who want to work out in the water

To take part: anyone wishing to join Healthy Life needs to complete a referral form and have it signed by a Health Care Professional (it does not need to be a GP). Ask for a referral form at your GP surgery or collect one from the SpArC Centre in Bishop's Castle. Completed forms can be returned to SpArC or emailed to: **amanda.arnold@serco.com**. Amanda, the Healthy Life Trainer, will then contact you to arrange an initial consultation.

What does Healthy Life include? After an initial consultation with the Healthy Life Trainer, a three-month standard centre membership plus, on Mondays, a gym programme tailored for you and/or Aqua Zumba and/or a gentle circuits class. A three-month referral membership costs £60. This entitles you to all the Centre's facilities including the Monday Healthy Life offer, but you must be referred by a health care professional.

Community Energy Group

Now is the time to take advantage of cheaper heating oil. The price of oil is usually at its highest during December to February.

You can save by being a part of our Oil Club. Community Resource is a local charity that runs a Community Oil Buying Club to reduce heating costs by making the most of joint buying power. Membership to the scheme is £27 per year and enables us to cover the admin costs for running this scheme.

Funding to Help Communities to Care for the Natural Environment in their Local Area

The Shropshire Hills Conservation Fund has reopened this Autumn and new applications are invited for projects to start in Spring 2026.

Fund priorities are:

Conserving and enhancing the natural beauty, landscape, wildlife or heritage of the Shropshire Hills National Landscape.

Educational and awareness-raising activities relating to the area and its conservation, especially involving young people.

We're keen to encourage applications from community groups. Grants are in the range of £500 - £2,000 and can make a real difference in converting great ideas into sustainable community action for nature and people.

Earlier this year, grants totalling just under £15,000, were awarded to nine practical projects with strong community engagement. These include funding the wildlife monitoring efforts of a parish council, creating a publicly accessible wildflower meadow and supporting a community wildlife group to deliver a programme of events.

The fair currently has a small and amazing group of volunteers on the committee, including some of the local business owners, but it is facing a recurring issue where there is no one to take the position of chair and ultimate responsibility for the fair. It is finding it increasingly difficult to manage the operational demands of running the festival.

The responsibilities around logistics, safety, stewarding, and administration are becoming more than the committee can reasonably sustain without additional support.

In order to ensure the future success and safety of the Michaelmas Fair the committee has therefore written to Bishop's Castle Town Council requesting a meeting to discuss support to help in: Coordinating key logistics such as road closures, signage, and health & safety requirements; Providing additional administrative support in the run-up to the event; Helping recruit and manage enough volunteers and stewards to cover the day; Taking responsibility and offering guidance and, where possible, resources to ensure the event remains viable long-term.

The Michaelmas Fair is part of the fabric of Bishop's Castle, but without more structured support, there is concern about the sustainability of the festival in its current form. The committee wants to retain the volunteers it has and attract more without fear of being burdened with this huge responsibility.

Bishop's Castle Surgery

High Covid and Flu Risk

The Covid and Flu vaccination clinic in October was very successful, treating several hundred patients. There are still some eligible patients who have not yet had their vaccinations. Do contact the surgery as soon as possible to make an appointment as **both viruses are on the increase**. The signs are that this is likely to be a very long flu season, and the virus appears to be more unpleasant and potentially dangerous than usual.

Surgery Team

The surgery continues to recruit new staff to complete the nursing team. A new Practice Nurse, Ashlee, has been appointed and is currently learning her way around the Practice, with another Practice Nurse, Monica planning to start in December. Interviews are taking place for a new Health Care Assistant who will be primarily responsible for phlebotomy services.

Bishop's Castle Pharmacy

Many patients will have noticed that the Pharmacy is having some difficulties, especially the lack of a permanent pharmacist. Many of the problems stem from the imminent change of ownership. Avicenna, who have run the pharmacy for several years, are in the process of selling the Bishop's Castle Pharmacy together with a number of other pharmacies in Shropshire. The White Grit Meadows Appeal

Wildflower meadows are one the rarest habitats in the UK. A local community land trust has been offered a rare and exciting opportunity to buy five acres of botanically rich meadow just over the Welsh border, at White Grit, within view of the mighty Corndon Hill.

"It's a fantasic site", exclaims the Chair of Middle Marches Community Land Trust, Dr. Richard Keymer. We have launched an appeal for £45,000 to ensure these small fields at White Grit will be there for future generations to enjoy.

Large billowing hedgerows enclose the meadows. On a summer's day there is a timeless feel to them as you wander from one room-like space to another, and it is all alive with bees, hoverflies and butterflies amongst the flowers. The site has been looked after by the present owners for 23 years, but they now need to relinquish their ownership, and have kindly offered the meadows to the trust to purchase.

Newsletters are bi-monthly (every two months)April/May, June/July, August/ September, October/November, December/January, and February/March: A total of 6 issues per year. Deadlines for copy are, as an absolute minimum, a full **15 working days before the 1**st of the newsletter month. Please send your copy or amendments in before this if you can, and especially if you are a first-time advertiser, to give enough time to resolve any issues.

Occasionally the Town Council may issue an extra newsletter, but this would normally be for public service information only and may not include adverts.

Costs:

Business card size per year: 60mm width x 30mm £56 per year/6 issues (equates to £9.34 per issue*).
